Jackson Elementary School

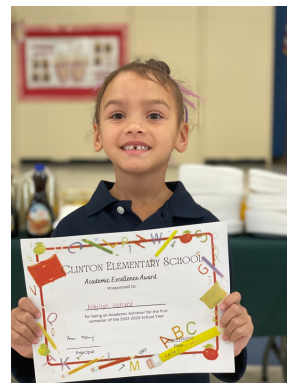
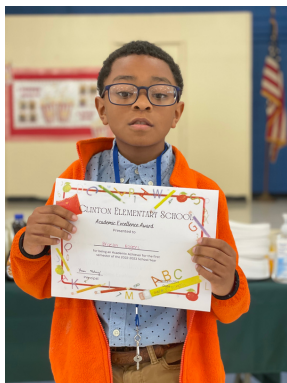

Students celebrated the achievements of African Americans during the CES Black History Program through speeches, dances, performances, and a skit.

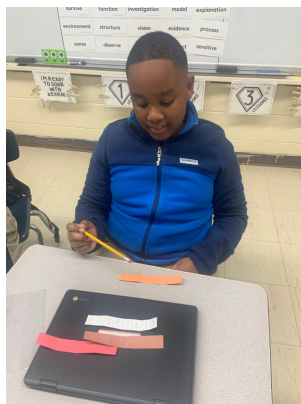


Celebrating Academic Excellence at CES
