Students at Clinton Elementary School developed their research and presentation skills during Black History Month by investigating different historical figures and creating a display box to show these figures' contributions to society.








Celebrating Read Across America Day in East Feliciana Public Schools

Because of East Feliciana Public Schools participation in the Community Eligibility Provision, all students


can eat breakfast at school each school day at no cost to families.








Exploring Art in East Feliciana Public Schools
