## State testing has started or will begin soon in all of our schools!



In addition to the detailed information you will receive or have received from your child's school, please remember these important tips:

- Make sure your child gets a good night's sleep on both the night before and two nights before any state test so they can be well-rested for the test.
- Make sure your child eats a good breakfast on the day of any state test to jumpstart their brain and improve their energy and focus. Breakfast is served at each school every day from 7:00-7:40 AM, so make sure your child gets to school on time so they eat breakfast!
- Encourage your child to try their best on all state tests.. We use the results of these tests to help plan the support we provide to your child, so remind your child that they should show us what they know!
- Remind your child that they should try to completely answer all parts of every question on their state tests. There are no penalties for making your best guess on any of our state tests!
- Ask your child to tell you about the important things they have learned in each subject and share with you the test-taking strategies they have learned.
   Explaining what you have learned to someone else helps it stick in your brain!
- Consider sharing with your child any special rituals you have for remaining calm or reducing stress. Having strategies to handle their stress will help your child to do their very best!
- Remind your child that you love them and that you are proud of them for persevering through a challenging year!


