Title:

In order to pursue its educational mission and also to protect the public's financial investment in the schools, the School Board shall from time to time engage the services of qualified professional consultants to provide new insights and ideas for dealing with especially difficult problems and to provide special services which present staff are unable to provide.

The kinds of assistant sought from consultants may include, but shall not be limited to: (1) conducting fact-finding studies, surveys and research; (2) providing counselor services requiring special expertise; and (3) assisting the School Board in developing policy and program recommendations.

The District Administrator should establish an efficient working relationship between the consultant and the School Board.
