B. Absentee Ballot Procedure

ABSENTEE BALLOTS - EDUCATION LAW, SEC. 2018-A

At any time after **April 21, 2023**, a person can pick up, or request it be mailed, an Application for an Absentee Ballot at the Business Office on Main Street, in Cairo. Absentee ballot applications must be received no later than 7 days before the day of the vote if the ballot is to be mailed to the voter or the day before the vote if the ballot is to be personally delivered.

How To Vote:

- 1. Mark in pencil or a pen having blue or black ink. Do not use colored pens or pencils.
- 2. To vote for a proposition listed on the ballot, make a single cross mark (X) or a check mark ($\sqrt{\ }$) on either the yes or no line below the proposition.
- 3. Any other mark or any erasure made on this ballot is unlawful.

How to Return Envelope:

- 1. After the ballot is marked, fold and insert into the Oath envelope, which is entitled "Election Material Please Expedite". **Do not include these instructions**.
- 2. Review the front of the envelope, turn over, read the "statement of absentee voter" and sign and date the envelope in the spaces indicated. If the Oath envelope is not correctly completed, the ballot will not be counted.
- 3. This envelope may be hand delivered to the Office of the District Clerk at 424 Main Street, Cairo, NY or postage may be affixed and the envelope may be mailed.
- 4. The Oath envelope with the ballot enclosed must reach the Office of the District Clerk not later than 5:00 p.m. on the date of the election, May 16, 2023.

VOTER QUALIFICATIONS

VOTERS at the annual meeting or any special school district meeting must possess the following qualifications:

- A Citizen of the United States;
- Eighteen (18) years of age or older by May 16, 2023;
- A resident within the District for a period of at least thirty (30) days immediately preceding the day of the vote; and
- Not otherwise unable to register for or vote at an election in accordance with provisions of Section 5-106 of the election law

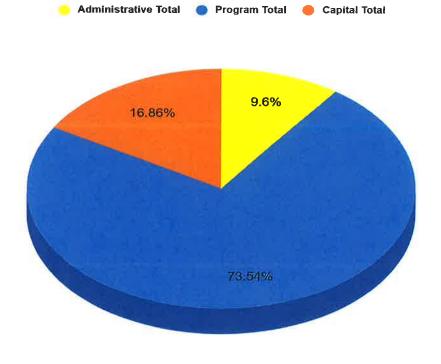

III. <u>PROGRAM</u>

TEACHING - REGULAR SCHOOL - CODE 2110/ CODE 2070

This section includes salaries for instructional and support personnel related to the general educational program at the elementary and secondary level. Priorities for regular instruction include the following:

I. Continued effort at elementary level for student achievement in Language Arts, Reading, Math and Writing;

II. Provide training, materials, and supplies that enhance student/teacher performance at all levels. The instructional component represents the largest dollar portion of the expenditure budget and is the focal point of our budget. Items contained here represent the "heart" of any educational system. This section represents 74% of the total budget. Included are expenses for the regular school program, such as supplies and materials, equipment, textbooks, contractual items, salaries of teachers and support staff, and BOCES services.

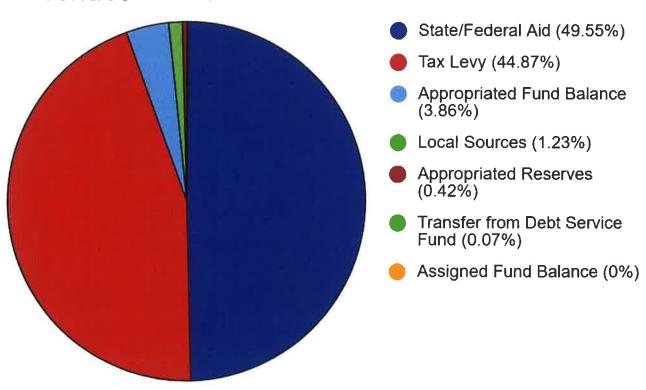

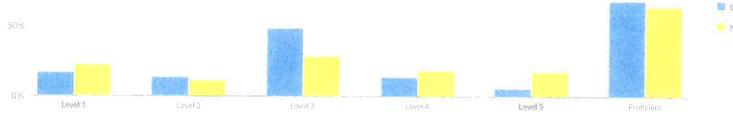
ANNUAL REGENTS EXAMINATION IN GEOMETRY (2021-22)

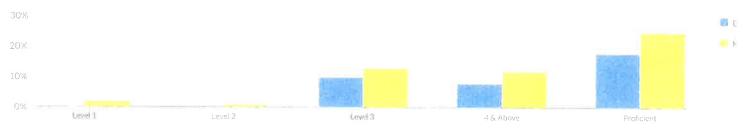
TOTAL COHORT REGENTS EXAMINATION RESULTS

Due to COVID-19 and changes to New York State testing requirements, Regents examinations in June 2020 through January 2022 were canceled, with the exception of the June 2021 Regents Examinations in ELA, Algebra I, Living Environment, and Physical Setting/Earth Science. The U.S. History & Government (Framework) June 2022 examination was also canceled. 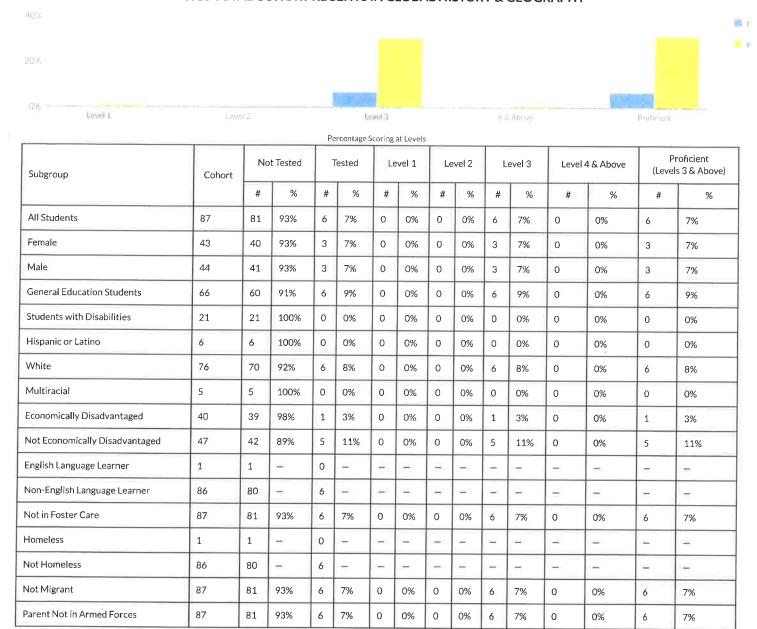

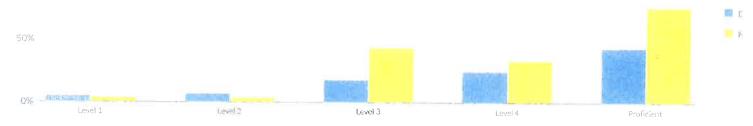
2018 TOTAL COHORT REGENTS IN GLOBAL HISTORY & GEOGRAPHY

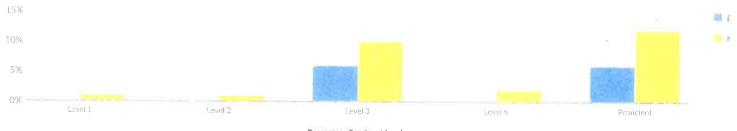

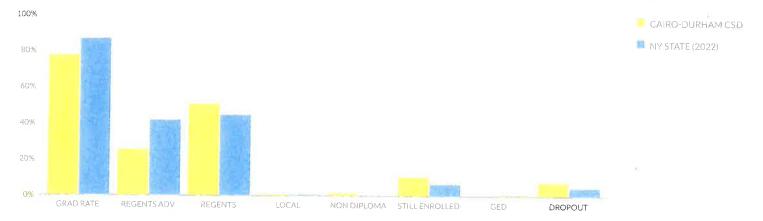

CAIRO-DURHAM CSD GRADUATION PATHWAYS DATA 2022

The Board of Regents approved regulations establishing multiple, comparably rigorous assessment pathways to graduation for all students. These regulations recognize the importance of engaging students' interests in rigorous and relevant academic programs in the Arts; Languages other than English (LOTE)/Biliteracy; Career and Technical Education (CTE); Humanities; Science, Technology, Engineering and Mathematics (STEM); Civic Readiness (CIVIC) and Career Developmental Occupational Studies (CDOS). The revised regulation allows students to use a passing score on an approved pathway assessment or successful completion of program requirements for the CDOS credential toward meeting the assessment requirements for graduation.
