Nurse's Corner:

The law requires students who are entering grades 7th, 9th, and 11th next year, will need a physical on file in the health office. Students entering 6th grade will need a Tdap no earlier than 10 years of age and no later than 11 years of age. Students who are entering 7th grade are required to have the first dose of meningococcal vaccine no earlier than 10 years of age. Students entering grade 12 will require second meningococcal immunization. New York State Public Health Law, Section 2164 requires that schools will not permit a child to attend school unless the parent provides the school with a certificate of



immunization proof. Immunizations can be also available through your local county health department at 518-719-3600.
