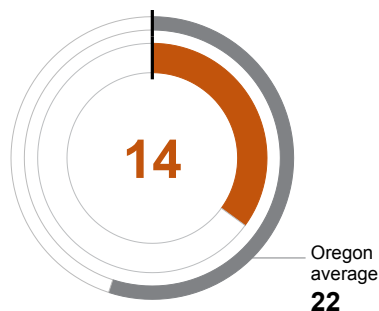

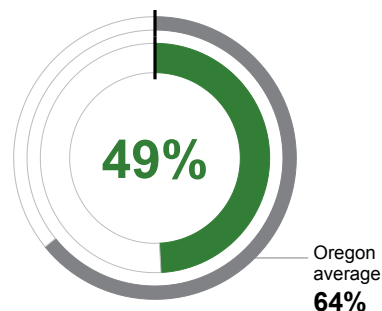
CLASS SIZE

REGULAR ATTENDERS

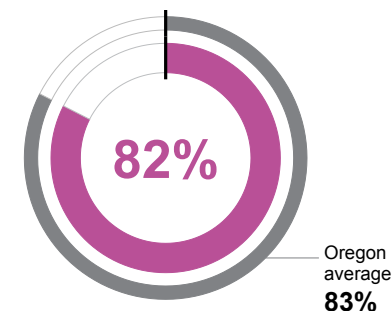

ON-TRACK TO GRADUATE

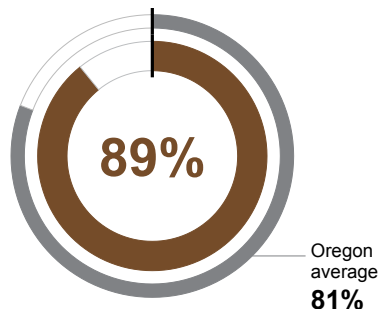
Students earning one-quarter of graduation credits in their 9th grade year.

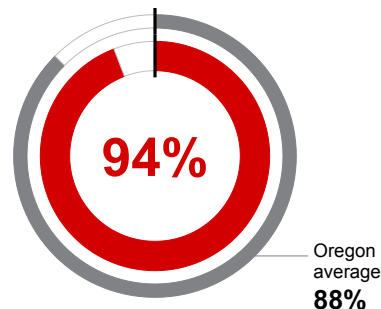
ON-TIME GRADUATION

Students earning a diploma within four years. Cohort includes students who were first-time ninth graders in 2017-18 graduating in 2020-21.



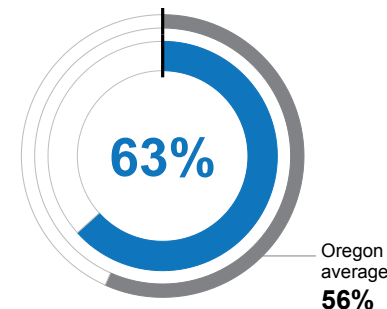
FIVE-YEAR COMPLETION

School Goals

Lakeview High School is an AVID school and our philosophy is that all students will be college and career ready at graduation. In addition, we have made goals as a staff, to improve our mathematics and english/language arts scores, increase support for our English language learners, and raise our daily attendance rate. Our school is continuing to work toward these goals with on and off site staff development, recent hires, and the addition of a Student Success Room to support trauma-informed teaching and learning.

State Goals

The Oregon Department of Education is partnering with school districts and local communities to ensure a 90% on-time, four year graduation rate by 2025. To progress toward this goal, the state will prioritize efforts to improve attendance, provide a well-rounded education, invest in implementing culturally responsive practices, and promote continuous improvement to close opportunity and achievement gaps for historically and currently underserved students.

Safe & Welcoming Environment

Lakeview High School staff is dedicated to providing a safe and welcoming environment. As a staff, we stand outside our doors at passing times to greet students and we spend time in the halls during passing times and lunch. The entire student council dedicated time decorating the school prior to the first day with school spirit and welcoming signs. This year, we completely remodeled our school entryway and added a key fob system to assist in making our school a safer and more welcoming place for students, staff, families, and the community.

About Our School

ADVANCED COURSEWORK

LHS offers multiple avenues for students to achieve credits in advanced courses. We currently partner with Klamath Community College and Oregon Institute of Technology for the following dual credit courses: biology, government/economics, Emergency Medical Response, medical terminology, horticulture, welding, honors English, and AP US History. We also have Expanded Options Programs or college coursework where the district pays tuition costs for qualified students to take college-level courses.

CAREER & TECHNICAL EDUCATION

Lakeview High School has a robust offering of CTE programs and, along with grants and Measure 98 funds, we continue to improve, expand, and update our CTE programs. LHS offers: computer information technology, computer applications/programming, agriculture work experience, introduction to agriculture industry, veterinary science, animal science, agriculture business, agriculture mechanics, skilled trades, floral/advanced floral, horticulture/advanced horticulture, culinary I,II,III,IV, baking, welding/advanced welding, woods, construction, small engines, medical terminology I,II,III, sports medicine, and emergency medical responder.

EXTRACURRICULAR ACTIVITIES

For a small, rural school, Lakeview High School has many extra-curricular activities for the students. We offer the traditional sports including football, volleyball, soccer, basketball, golf, baseball, softball, cross country, wrestling, track. We also have local organizations that provide students with a ski team, equestrian team, etc. We also have a strong FFA program, and very active ASB and honor society organizations.

PARENT & COMMUNITY ENGAGEMENT

The school strives to get full parent and community engagement. We have multiple parent nights, host monthly senior parent nights, and actively recruit class presenters for careers, college, and military experiences. We have an active booster club. As a rural, isolated community, our school is our community's main source of activities. Our campus is very busy everyday, all day, with multiple community events throughout the year.
