During Round-Up, the teachers will collect your child's paperwork, including your child's immunization record and birth certificate. Each child will receive a kindergarten resource bag. Please plan on 10 to 20 minutes for the registration process.

The State of Michigan has established that children who are five years old on or before September 1, 2022 are eligible to enroll in school.

Gobles Physics Luge and Skating Adventure

The Gobles physics class along with the biomedical students traveled to North Muskegon to try their luck in the Olympic sport of luge, as well as ice skating. Bob Lisowski, Gobles physics teacher, said, "This trip is a great way for students to experience the physics concepts of motion, force, inertia, gravity, and friction in a way they will never forget." The Muskegon Luge Adventure Sports Park, offers ice skating, cross-country skiing, sledding, a winter zip line, and its biggest attraction the luge. The park's luge track is one of only four luge tracks in the United States. It's the only kunst bahn track (German for artificial track) made from natural ice and not refrigerated. The track is 850 feet long and was designed by three-time Olympian Frank Masley. The Muskegon track is shorter in length than the tracks in Lake Placid or Salt Lake City but does provide an Olympic thrill with the first-time luge athlete in mind. It consists of six curves and two starting areas and participants can reach speeds in excess of 30 mph. During the day the 21 students received training, equipment, sliding time, and a competitive race followed by an Olympic style awards ceremony. Boys gold medalist, Anda Watanasirwanich, said, "Luging was fun but scary when you are moving so fast." Girls gold medalist, Kaya Huizenga, said, "I thought I was not going to try it. Then after I went down the track five times, I realized how awesome of an experience it was and would love to do it again." Following the luge ceremony, students laced up their ice skates to display their hockey and figure skating skills. Over half of the students were new to ice skating but were excited to give it a try.
