This year we have expanded our continuous improvement efforts by engaging a group of parents and staff in what is known as SIAC, or School Improvement Advisory Committee. The purpose of this group is to provide the administration and school board with input on all programming related to the school. During bi-weekly meetings we will be discussing items such as curriculum, instruction, assessment, grading, parent communication, and school discipline. Our goal is to ensure that the decisions being made by school leaders are resulting in outcomes that positively affect the students and families that we serve.

So far we have made substantial progress in identifying our current strengths along with opportunities for us to improve. Many of our recent conversations have pertained to the teaching and assessing of foundational literacy and math skills. Following the input we receive from our SIAC group we have been able to revisit our current systems with staff to discuss and implement better ways of educating our students. Following this review process we report out our actions to both the SIAC group as well as our school board. We are eager to continue this new partnership with our families to make sure that we are considering the needs and interests of all the families that we have the pleasure of working with.

We hope that by opening this new line of communication will be more closely connected to the perceptions and needs of the Andrew community. Not only do we ask for input from SIAC members, but we have also spent a great deal of time educating our team so that they can help inform and advocate for our school. Any and all Andrew residents are encouraged to provide input by speaking with staff and administration when they have ideas about how we can improve our school. Of course, it is always better to speak with the person most closely associated with the issue, but we welcome any feedback that would assist our SIAC team. If you have input that you feel would be great for our SIAC team to discuss please email our principal or superintendent.

The most recent project our SIAC group is working on is the development of a parent survey. We hope to be sending it out in the next month to gather information about topics that Andrew families would like to learn more about. These topics might include things like grading, homework, or another area of interest. Please look for this opportunity to provide input along with other chances for your voice to be heard. Together, we will continue to make Andrew CSD the best school for our kids and our community!

From The Principal's Desk



Behind the Results

As a new school year begins, districts are receiving last year's data and making plans to enhance student learning for the upcoming year. Andrew Community School is proud to share their results from last year! Before sharing these results, it is important to understand the process that goes into achieving these numbers.

In the fall, kindergarten through fifth grade students are given reading assessments called FAST assessments, to test their current abilities. After the assessments are administered, staff meet in Professional Learning Community Teams to look at and analyze the data that was gathered. These teams work together to place kids in appropriate learning groups. The groups are designed to target specific academic deficits based on student results and teacher observations. After placing the students in meaningful groups, the staff strategically plan for the intervention or enrichment groups using research-based lessons. The lessons are taught in small groups for three weeks. After three weeks, students are re-assessed to see if they have gained the needed skills or if they need more time in the group to achieve those skills. If students have obtained the needed skills, they are then placed in a new group that focuses on other areas of need and the process begins again. The FAST assessments are given again in the winter and spring to see what progress each student is making.

The numbers support that the process at Andrew is working. The state compiles the scores from kindergarten through third grade and this is the information they report out. In the fall of 2017 Andrew had 49/75 (65.3%) students reading at or above grade level. This ranked Andrew 304/392 schools reporting in lowa. After all the work of staff, students were reassessed in the spring and Andrew had 61/73 (83.6%) students reading at or above grade level, ranking them 37/391 among schools reporting in lowa. This places Andrew in the top 10% for FAST scores in the entire state. The growth from fall to spring increased 18.2% and was the 5th highest in the state. These are numbers to celebrate! Looking at the data, it's clear to see the systems put into place at Andrew are providing students top-of-the-line instruction that strives to meet all student learning needs.



With the cooler temperatures upon us please remember to send a jacket to school with your child.



Asbestos Notification 2018

Each year the school district is required to notify the public concerning asbestos in the schools. The district has an asbestos management plan, which is available to the public, which details the specific asbestos building material in the school building. The district's primary asbestos materials include floor tile, and some mudded pipe joints in the maintenance tunnels. All of the materials are inspected on a regular basis and the results of those inspections are included in the management plan. For asbestos to be dangerous to the human health it must be in a friable condition, one that allows fibers to enter the air. The district has no exposed friable asbestos materials and all asbestos containing building materials are in good condition. The district believes that there is no threat to the health of students, staff, or visitors to the building form asbestos building materials. The Andrew Community School district is a member of the consortium of schools in the area, which has it's own asbestos technician who oversees the compliance issues and provides technical assistance. We are just finishing up the Solar System and will be onto the water cycle, earth systems and earth history! The Maquoketa Caves are closing soon so we are going to get in there and get some prior knowledge before starting the unit.

We are teaming with Jessica Wagner from the Hurstville Interpretive Center and two other conservationists to guide us through the caves.

The NGSS Science standards that we will be studying at the Maquoketa Caves are:

- 1. Understand and apply knowledge of the water cycle, including events that impact groundwater quality.
- 2. Understand and apply knowledge of the structure and processes of the earth system and the change of the earth and its surface.
- 3. Understand and apply knowledge of earth history based on physical evidence.
