


Jason Van Beek - Facilities, Grounds, and Transportation

Changes to the School Nutrition Program for 2022-23

On June 30, 2022, the Federal Government discontinued the universal free meal program for students. Students will once again be paying for meals during breakfast and lunch unless they qualify for free or reduced meals. Therefore, we are encouraging all families to fill out paperwork for free and reduced meals. The paperwork will be included in student packets at the beginning of the school year and the paperwork needs to be turned back into the school by Thursday, September 1st. For the past two years, there has not been a need to set meal prices; therefore, there will be increases and the new prices follow:

Schedule Changes from Last Year to This Year





For the 2022-23 school year, preschool classes will be on Monday, Tuesday, Wednesday, and Thursday. No classes on Fridays. The actual times will remain the same: three year old students will meet in the mornings from 8:00 am to 11:00 am and four year old students will meet in the afternoons from 11:40 am to 3:20 pm.

The additional time for the four year old students will allow us to meet hour requirements from the state and provide some cushion for possible snow days. At this time the state does not have hour requirements for the three year olds.

One of the needs for our district is to establish a consistent time for staff collaboration. We tried utilizing Wednesdays last year and encountered some problems. This year we will be dismissing school each Friday at 12:30 pm and the After School Program will begin and end earlier on Fridays. We will use Friday afternoons for staff development. We are doing curriculum work throughout the year including the



continuation of our Professional Learning Communities (PLC's) where teachers will meet by grade level and by content area. We will also conduct staff meetings and PBIS Team Meetings during the early releases on Fridays. The consistent communication and collaboration time will help our teachers.



Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports

PBiS Overview:



Crawford Public Schools is in the 2nd year of implementing PBiS at both the Elementary and at the High School. PBIS Teams were established in both buildings and these teams meet at least once a month during the school year. Four umbrella goals were established for the school district. These umbrella goals are Respect, Accountability, Maximize effort, and Safety or RAMS for short. The staff then used these umbrella goals to come up with desired expectations for the students. These expectations are stated in a positive manner, for example: "students will walk in the hallway" instead of "Do NOT run in the hallway". There are different and unique expectations for various places in the school such as: classroom, hallway, lunch room, riding the bus...etc. These expectations will be taught by all the teachers to all the students in a uniform manner at the beginning of the year. Staff members then reward students (both verbally and tangibly) when students are meeting the desired expectations.

Instead of just focusing on negative behavior, the goal of PBiS is to encourage positive behavior. However, students still receive discipline and consequences for improper behavior. It is a three to five year process to fully implement PBiS, however, schools that have implemented PBiS with fidelity have seen a dramatic reduction in disruptive behavior and an increase in student achievement. These are the main reasons we are implementing PBIS.

What is PBiS?

Positive Behavior Interventions and Supports or (PBIS) is an evidence-based data-informed, process that works to increase student achievement, school attendance, and school success while decreasing challenging student behaviors. By working together, students, staff, and parents can help create a safer more effective environment.

Behavior expectations are defined, taught, and reviewed with all students. The expectations are posted throughout the school in designated areas.

We encourage parents to use the same expectations and rules that the school teaches. This common language creates consistency and a unified support for expected student behavior.



Goal of PBiS

The American Heritage Dictionary defines discipline as "training that is expected to produce a specific character or pattern of behaviors, especially training that produces moral or mental improvement." This is the focus of PBiS in Crawford. Like reading and math, behavior can be taught and the ultimate goal is to prevent or at least reduce problem behaviors while creating more positive learning environments for all students.

PBiS...

- Benefits all students and is not limited to any particular group.
- Approaches behavior in a proactive way by teaching appropriate behaviors.
- Fosters positive adult-to-student relationships.
- Supports CPS School Improvement Goals.
- Is focused on improving academic achievement by creating a safe and positive environment.


