Building Partnerships/ Communication about Student Learning

CCMS is committed to frequent twoway communication with families about children's learning. Some of the ways you can expect us to reach you are:

- Class Dojo for behavior and messaging- this is a wonderful tool you will want to download on your phone as an app.

The 6th-8TH grade classroom will work with students and their families to support students' success in reading and math. Some of our key connections with families will be:

- 1. Edgenuity, Milestone Prep, and MAP, Progress Learning, Accelerated Reader are programs students will utilize and have access to in the classroom and at home.
- 2. Students will receive a variety of daily reading exercises to address fluency, vocabulary, and comprehension.
- 3. Google Classroom will be a platform used to communicate with students regarding the submission of assignments and instructional feedback.
- 4. MAP scores sent home 3 times throughout the school year.
- 5. Utilization of PowerSchool to monitor students' progress, feedback, and assignment scores.
- 6. Apply and reinforce math concepts learned in class by watching instructional videos and completing guided activities.
- 7. Journal writing to include vocabulary practice and examples across all subject areas.

CCMS students joined staff and parents to develop ideas about how they can succeed in school and reach for the stars. Students thought of the following ideas to make connections between learning at home and school:

- I will log into Accelerated Reader and MAP after school hours to work on building my skills.
- I will ready daily to increase my fluency, comprehension, and vocabulary.
- I will focus on MAP testing and do my best. I will also share my MAP scores with my family.
- 4. I will check Google classroom for assignments and instructional feedback.
- 5. I will encourage my family to check PowerSchool to monitor my progress in my classes.
- 6. I will apply math concepts learned in class.
- 7. I will work on my writing skills daily

At CCMS parents joined staff to develop ideas about how families can support students' success in reading. Families may have other ideas to add to this list.

- 1. I will encourage my child to log in to Edgenuity, Milestone Prep, and i-Ready Math.
- 2. I will encourage my child to ready daily and complete reading exercises to enhance comprehension.
- 3. I will check my child's MAP scores.
- 4. I will encourage my child to check Google Classroom frequently.
- 5. I will use PowerSchool to monitor my students' progress, feedback and assignment scores.
- 6. I will encourage my child to apply math concepts at home learned in class by watching instructional videos and completing guided activities.
- 7. I will encourage my child to write more.

Reading Activities to Support Your 6TH, 7th and 8th Graders

- Read and research together. Discuss and present what you have read and learned.
- Compare perspectives: read two or more different texts, and discuss how they are alike and different.
- Read magazine and newspaper articles with nonfiction text features such as charts, captions, graphs, illustrations, etc. Ask your child to describe what they show, how to interpret the information, and discuss how the information conveyed by each feature helps you better understand the text.
- Encourage your child to read for 20 minutes (or more) each day.

Writing Activities to Support Your 6th, 7th and 8th Graders

- Have your child email teachers, friends, or family members in which they write about their day and what they learned.
- Have your child keep an up to calendar of upcoming assignments/homework and events.
- Allow your child to practice typing to work on speed, accuracy, and form on a word processing program. Sending emails back and forth to your child can be a fun way to achieve this goal!
- Allow your child to do research and discuss new discoveries with you.
- Have your child write a story about a real event with an introduction and conclusion, as well as a body which includes dialogue and sensory details conveying a real event.
- Have your child write a how to essay with an introduction, step by step instructions, and a conclusion. (How to: Make a sandwich, run a football play, apply makeup)
- Have your child write an opinion piece with an introduction, a clearly identified opinion, reasons supporting their opinion, and a conclusion. Using facts to support your opinions.
- Have your child write short pieces (over a few days) and longer pieces (over a few weeks).
