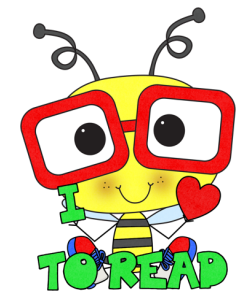
1. **Read 10 books** (35 pages in a chapter book will be equal to one book) **outside of the school day**.

# You did it! Congratulations!



The parent volunteer in your classroom has a set day of the week she/he will be in for book conferences. **Remember** you will need your *R.E.A.D. Validation Form* and your book to have a conference.

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Remember: Books too easy or too hard do not help you to become a better reader. Use the “five finger rule” for deciding if a book is too hard. If there are five words on the page that you can’t figure out, the book is probably too hard. Try to pick books that are “just right” for you to **read by yourself**. Parent volunteers will help you with this when they conference with you.

*(First graders may “share the book” or “echo read” with their parents up to January 1<sup>st</sup>; then all reading must be independently done to qualify for the R.E.A.D. Program.)*
