A Message From Principal, Dr. Aaron Slack

As a parent and as an educator, I find it increasingly challenging to "compete" with personal electronic devices and online content when it comes to encouraging my children to read. At the same time, however, there are more engaging, highinterest books available to young readers than ever before. They are available to students at our school library as well as through the Yates Public Library. Last summer, our English teachers developed a framework to encourage independent student reading during the summer. We believe it struck the appropriate balance between structured accountability and student choice. I encourage all of our 7th and 8th grade students to continue reading year round and independently in order to complete their "steps" for the American **Reading Company** program, With February break on the way, I encourage you to offer your children incentives to read independently.

As we near the end of a long winter season, we must also prepare students for state assessments. In the past, the results of ELA and mathematics assessments at grades 7 & 8 were tied to teacher and principal evaluations. Due to a statewide moratorium, this is no longer the case. In the past, we have had small numbers of students "opt out" of these tests. Moving forward, I would like to state that we strongly discourage this practice. These tests are designed to help us identify student strengths and improvement opportunities. This data will better allow us to understand students' readiness for success in high school. Should students choose to opt out of this year's state tests, they will be given an equivalent local assessment so that we may gather this data.

Finally, I am excited to share that our school is currently holding another campaign to promote acts of kindness. Our "Have a Heart" campaign is designed to reward students for demonstrating kind and caring behavior. When staff members observe students demonstrating behavior that shows kindness or respect, they will be rewarding them with a "Tiger Ticket." When awarding a Tiger Ticket, a staff member will tell the student why he/she is receiving it, providing specific feedback on the type of behavior demonstrated. These tickets may later be redeemed at our school store for Valentine themed items that will be for sale.

Thank you all for all you do to help support our students and our efforts to promote a safe atmosphere in our school!

COLD AND FLU SEASON IS HERE!

Cold and Flu season is here, again! In order to minimize the spread of colds and flu, please read the information below. Colds and flu are most contagious during the first 48 hours. A child who has even vague symptoms should be observed closely and be kept home if these symptoms progress. Here at school we continue to provide daily cleaning of common surfaces both in the classroom and in multi-use spaces. Encourage your children to cover their coughs, not to touch the areas around their eyes, nose and mouths and to wash their hands often, when possible and to use hand sanitizer when soap and water is not available.

Sore Throat	Sometimes	Common	
Chest Discomfort, Cough	Common; can be severe	Mild to moderate; hacking cough	
Headache	Common	Rare	

What are the emergency warning signs of flu sickness in children? Seek immediate medical attention if you notice the following: fast breathing, trouble breathing, bluish skin color, not drinking enough fluids, not waking or not interacting, being so irritable does not want to be touched or held, Flu-like symptoms improve but than return with fever and worse cough, and/ or fever with rash.

Take everyday preventive actions to stop the spread of germs.

- In the Try to avoid close contact with sick people.
- ② While sick, limit contact with others as much as possible to keep from infecting them.
- If you are sick with flu-like illness, CDC recommends that you stay home for at least 24 hours after your fever is gone except to get medical care or for other necessities. (Your fever should be gone for 24 hours without the use of a fever reducing medicine.)
- Cover your nose and mouth with a tissue when you cough or sneeze. Throw the tissue in the trash after you use it.
- Wash your hands often with soap and water. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand rub.
- ② Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth. Germs spread this way.
- ② Clean and disinfect surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with germs like the flu.




