## Scholarship Application Information

The Atomic Credit Union Scholarship Program has been established to recognize and assist those students in need at our high schools with student-run credit union branches, including Career Technology Centers, who desire to further their education. Scholarships in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500.00) will be awarded and disbursed among our participating student-run high schools. Additionally, two scholarships in the amount of five hundred dollars (\$500) will be awarded to our membership at large. By the end of the first term, proof of enrollment (schedule, school invoice or verification letter from the Registrar's office) must be emailed to <a href="mailto:ldenney@atomiccu.com">ldenney@atomiccu.com</a>. When the proof of enrollment is received indicating the student did, in fact, enroll/attend an accredited school, the sum of \$500 will be deposited in the student's Atomic Credit Union account.

The applicant must be a 2023 graduating senior of a high school or technical school and have plans to enroll or be currently enrolled in an accredited school of higher education as a full-time student in the summer or fall of 2023. The applicant must have a minimum 2.5 GPA on a 4.0 scale.

The <u>applicant (student) must be a current member</u> of Atomic Credit Union with the account being opened no later than December 31st, 2022.

The following information must be submitted in a large manila envelope and received at any of our office locations no later than 6:00 PM on <u>Friday, March 31, 2023.</u> Our office locations are: Athens, Beaver, Chillicothe – Bridge St, Chillicothe – Western Ave., Jackson, Logan, Lucasville, Minford, Oak Hill, Piketon, Portsmouth, Washington Court House, Waverly, Wellston and Wheelersburg.

- 1. Completed application form provided by Atomic Credit Union.
- 2. Official copy of the applicant's 7th semester transcript, which lists accumulative GPA.
- 3. Official ACT or SAT results listed on transcript of grades, and rank in class.
- 4. Handwritten essay, 200 words maximum, on the following question:
