Securing Safety and Security

As our thinking related to safety and security at the elementary school level continues to evolve, I want to share with you Huron Valley Schools' commitment to keeping our students safe at school each and every day. In Huron Valley, all visitors to our building have to be given access to the building through our new safe entry at the front of the building. Our office staff greets each visitor and makes sure access to the building is only given under very specific circumstances. Visitors coming to school to pick up their child(ren) are always asked for identification and students are only released to adults who are on their emergency card(s).

It is important to know that all visitors requesting access to the building (beyond the main office) must have a Criminal Records Check, known as a CRC, on file with us at Kurtz. In the past, it has been our practice to allow visitors into the building to attend events, classroom parties and to visit classrooms as authorized and scheduled by classroom teachers. In the past, we did not require a CRC unless a known visitor was going to be working with or supporting students outside of the teacher or staff member's ability to provide direct supervision.

Effective immediately, we are requiring all visitors requesting access to class-rooms and to students to have a CRC on file with us in the office. This practice increases our ability to ensure the safety of every person in our school. We recognize that this practice may come as a surprise to some of our stakeholders. I ask for everyone's cooperation as we establish this as a new and soon-to-be, common practice.

CRC forms can be obtained at the main office or by downloading a copy of the form on the Kurtz Connection SMORE sent this month. There could be up to a two week turnaround time on the completion of a CRC, once it has been completed and submitted to our central office team. A CRC is good for the entire school year that it was issued. All CRC's are kept in the main office and teachers are provided with a list of parents and/or guardians that have a valid CRC on file. If you have questions or concerns about this distinct level process, please reach out to Mr. Chisik as you see fit.











Smartwatches at School

We would like to wish everyone a Happy New Year and we hope your break was everything you needed it to be and more! As 2023 gets underway, we are noticing that many of our students are coming back to school with smartwatches. A smartwatch is a watch that also acts as a Personal Communication Device (PCD).

Like cell phones, smartwatches are allowed in school. However, in order to ensure that these devices are not a distraction and do not encroach on safety and security, we do have Board Policy 5136 governing usage. Here at Kurtz, and in conjunction with Board Policy, the following applies:

- Smartwatches may be worn throughout the day but should only be used for accessing the time and date.
- Much like cell phones, texting between watches (or

other PCDs) from student to student, during school hours, is not permitted.

- During school hours, any phone calls (outgoing or incoming) should be made through the office only. This is to ensure safety and clear lines of communication for our staff and parents.
- At no time during the school day should smartwatches be



used to take pictures, record audio or record videos of others.

 Much like cell phones, unless permitted by the teacher, students should refrain from accessing the internet during the school day.

Again, a more detailed explanation on PCD usage can be found in Board Policy 5136 on the www.hvs.org website. If your child has a smartwatch, please talk to him/her about appropriate usage at school. To simplify the conversation, have them think of a smartwatch as a cell phone on the wrist. All of the same expectations that come with having a cell phone at school, hold true for smartwatches.

We continue to be focused on students interacting socially with each other during the school day. We will continue to work diligently to promote positive and appropriate social and emotional growth for all students during the school day. Please join this focus and help us to minimize distractions, especially during the school day.

Principals at Work!

You may recall that the top earners in our Color Run each year receive the honor of becoming principal for 1/2 day. In December, our top 2 earners expanded to 3, in order to recognize an amazing set of twins at Kurtz. The girls all had a blast as they planned their time, supported their teachers,

took their whole classes out for an additional recess and had a special lunch with friends.

Thank you to these families and to all of our families for supporting your PTA and as the funding allocated supports all students at Kurtz!






Pick Up and Drop Off

We are very proud of the pickup and drop-off processes we have in place at Kurtz. We work hard to make this daily routine safe and effective. There are Kurtz staff members assigned to ensuring our systems work effectively, while still making sure to use the time to connect with students and provide support when and if support is needed. We assure you that our system works and is most effective when visitors follow our plan. We are always focused on getting you in and out of the parking lot as quickly as possible. Visitors can help us make pick-up and drop-off times flow best by not parking on the curb during pick-up and drop-off times.

- Mind the 15 MPH speed limit on Kurtz Drive.
- Vehicles should be pulling up and quickly getting child(ren) in and out of the car. Please do not get out and help children in or out of the vehicle.
- Utilize pick-up and drop-off

- Kurtz staff or park if your child requires extra support.
- Visitors should never pass in the left lane of the loop because it is not safe for our students and could (and has) resulted in damage to vehicles, adding unneces-

sary stress on individuals. We feel strongly that passing really only has the potential to save a few seconds on your commute and



If you are planning to park, please park in a designate parking space. Kurtz staff members park in the back of the lot in order to make it as easy as possible for parents to find a parking space in our small parking lot. Also, students should never

be walking through the parking lot without an adult. Parents, please observe the posted speed limit sign on Kurtz Drive.

 We ask parents to respect our neighbors and never

block driveways when you are picking up or dropping off. We have also been contacted by our neighbors at the Document Store to ask parents not to use their parking lot as a pick-up space.

Parents are not to escort their child(ren) to their classrooms for various health and

safety reasons. Teachers meet their students outside each morning to start the day in a positive and personal manner. Your participation in this process is both expected and appreciated.
