Student Profiles are Now Available

Each year, the staff at Kurtz looks for parent input in the rostering of students for the upcoming school year. We go to great lengths to work as a team, with the common vision of creating balanced classrooms for each and every student at school.

Our goal is to start with parent input. The Student Profile Google Form has been sent out via Family Access and is also attached to the Kurtz Connection Smore. This resource provides parents the opportunity to share their thoughts related to placement, before teachers place children into new classes.

There are many things we consider in order to create these balanced classes. Once the process has been completed, changes are extremely challenging to make and even more rarely considered.

The best way parents can make sure their recommendations/requests are considered is to speak directly with the sending teacher, the teacher your child currently has this year. Your child's current teacher will work diligently to make sure parent rationale is considered and is able to advocate for placement, however, there are many obstacles that make granting parent requests difficult and/or challenging.

We ask that parents utilize the Student Profile process, including communicating with the classroom teacher, in order to best ensure the placement process is a success. Please respect the work that is put into this process and make sure that any communications, (the Student Profile Form and communication with your child's teacher) about

student placement for the 23-24 school year are completed by April 28.

Summer Extension

The summer school program this year will be called Summer Extension. It will extend grade level content from the 2022-23 school year and provide additional academic support in reading and math for students that have not demonstrated mastery of essential standards/skills. Instructional content in this program will target individual gaps in learning from the 2022-23 school year.

Students will be invited to participate if they meet the following criteria:

- Enrolled in Huron Valley Schools during the 2022-23 school year
- Enrolled in grades K-5 during the 2022-23 school

year

- Performance on key assessment indicators identifies gaps in grade level mastery of essential content
- Reading students currently on an individualized reading plan (IRP) or below grade level on reading benchmark assessments
- Math students below grade level on domains within i-Ready, NWEA MAP and district common math assessments
- Instructional staff indicates a student's need for targeted instructional support in reading and/or math to promote academic readiness for the next

grade level.

The program's main goal will be for students to demonstrate reading and math proficiency with grade-level standards. HVS certified teachers will be matched with students to address gaps in reading and math.

Transportation, breakfast and Grab-and-Go lunch will be provided. Students will be invited to attend one of two sessions:

Session 1: July 11 - July 27, 2023 (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday)

Session 2: August 1 - August 17, 2023 (Tuesday, Wednesday, Thursday)

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
Pick Up and Drop Off

We are very proud of the pickup and drop-off processes we have in place at Kurtz. We work hard to make this daily routine safe and effective. There are Kurtz staff members assigned to ensuring our systems work effectively, while still making sure to use the time to connect with students and provide support when and if support is needed. We assure you that our system works and is most effective when visitors follow our plan. We are always focused on getting you in and out of the parking lot as quickly as possible. Visitors can help us make pick-up and drop-off times flow best by not parking on the curb during pick-up and drop-off times.

- Mind the 15 MPH speed limit on Kurtz Drive.
- Vehicles should be pulling all the way up and quickly getting child(ren) in and out of the car. Please do not get out and help children in or out of the vehicle.

- Utilize pick-up and drop-off Kurtz staff or park if your child requires extra support.
- Visitors should never pass in the left lane of the loop because it is not safe for our students and could (and has) resulted in damage to

vehicles, adding unnecessary stress on individuals. We feel strongly that passing really only has the potential to save a few sec-



 If you are planning to park, please park in a designate parking space. Kurtz staff members park in the back of the lot in order to make it as easy as possible for parents to find a parking space in our small parking lot. Also, students should never be walking through the parking lot without an adult. Parents, please observe the posted speed limit sign on Kurtz Drive.

We ask parents to respect

our neighbors and never block driveways when you are picking up or dropping off. We have also been contacted by our neighbors at the Document Store to ask parents not to use their parking lot as a pick-up space.

Parents are not to escort their child(ren) to their classrooms for

various health and safety reasons. Teachers meet their students outside each morning to start the day in a positive and personal manner.
