Three Hope High School students in the Orientation to Teaching program were in classrooms at Clinton Primary School in March. First year students in the program are required to complete 45 hours of classroom observations, according to Orientation to Teaching instructor Terri Hoglund. Second-year students must complete 60 hours of classroom time, Hoglund said. The program is part of the concurrent credit studies offerings at Hope High School which allows students to complete high school coursework and college credit work through the University of Arkansas Hope-Texarkana, leading to a paraprofessional certification. Students may also qualify to work as classroom paraprofessionals in the Hope Public Schools while competing a teaching degree.
