6.4.1 Dr. Gretchen Skrotzki, Bishop Elementary School Principal

- Josh Nicholson thanked Ms. Skrotzki for sharing her weekly "Principal's Corner"
- Kathy Zack asked about numbers of students in Title 1 GS responded that there are about 10-15 students in grades 2-5 with 20 4th graders being pulled out of their class to attend in the mornings.
- Steve Elia asked for an AVID update. Response: binders, calendars and folders are being utilized. So far teachers like the organizational piece of AVID. He asked that she add board members to the walk through invites.
- -Steve Elia also asked if SMART goals and findings in dual program could be published in the future yes.
- Josh Nicholson asked that law enforcement be invited to participate in "3-in-1" drills. Hoping that students might take it more seriously. It was suggested that law enforcement should be present during the "Great Shake Out" drills taking place on Oct 18th at 10:18am.
- Taylor Ludwick asked for update on bike path. Mr. Ellis (attendee) shared knowledge that a property issue with DWP is delaying the project.
- Trina Orrill asked about the McGraw Hill and online teacher component. GS answered that some are using it more than others possibly because it's time consuming.

6.4.2 Patrick Twomey/Derek Moisant, Home Street Middle School Principal

- PT added to his report that the first mentor feedback meeting indicated it's a positive program and is good for team building.
- Steve Elia suggested some kind of score cards/recording for students by mentor advisors for checking grades, behaviors and absenteeism.
- Taylor Ludwick asked if chronic absenteeism numbers were accurate yes. Most agreed it's more of a problem in grades 6-12.
- Josh Nicholson are we providing encouragement and support for not only college bound students but for students interested in technical career pathways? District wide AVID is in the early stage of development for college career and readiness will keep updating progress. BUSD teacher, Nancy Thornburg expressed concern and confusion after attending AVID conference. She felt that AVID did not include the idea of junior colleges and trade schools. It was decided that sites needed to add these options to the program and revisit this in January. It's important to instill the mindset that there are many opportunities for college, trade school and the military after graduation.

6.4.3 Katie Kolker, Palisade Glacier High School Principal

-KK added that they are working on social emotional learning and interviewing students. Students think it's important and necessary and staff is on board as well.

-Steve Elia stated that in regards to AVID and the college career readiness, the capstone program at PGHS helps reinforce the idea of attending college.

-RC added the new AVID coordinator at BUHS – Jolie Glaser. Candice Tonseth is also helping out. -Kathy Zack acknowledged the walk through and EDI implementation taking place later in the week and asked if it could be done more than once a week to help increase classroom visits.

- -Steve Elia in regards to the A-G requirements, how do we let students know where they stand? RC indicated they are informed in homeroom but can find out from any teacher as they have immediate access to student profiles. Very solid communication.
- Seniors Success reinforce trade school path and taught by Annette Holland. Uses a diagnostic tool to inform students of options.
- -Delano football game good sportsmanship and good coaching.
