## COMMUNITY

Midwest City, Oklahoma, is located immediately east of Oklahoma City. Approximately 57,000 residents enjoy 25 square miles of urban, suburban, and rural areas. Midwest City is home to Tinker Air Force Base and Rose State College. Racial, ethnic and socio-economic diversity reflects that of the state of Oklahoma.

## SCHOOL

Founded in 1943, Midwest City High School, home of the "Bombers," is one of 25 schools in the Mid-Del Public School District. MCHS is a comprehensive public high school serving grades nine through twelve with an enrollment of approximately 1,350 students. MCHS utilizes a Traditional Schedule with seven 50-minute class periods. Vocational training is available through the Mid-Del Technology Center that is part of the Mid-Del Schools.

## ACCREDITATION

MCHS is accredited through the North Central Association, the Oklahoma State Department of Education and the Oklahoma Secondary Schools Association.
