What is Softball?

Everyone doesn't know a lot about softball. Here are some answers to the question: What is softball?

Softball is a modified form of baseball played on a smaller field with a larger ball, seven innings instead of nine and underarm pitching. The game evolved during the late 19th century from a form of indoor baseball.

The game was invented in 1887 in Chicago, Illinois as an indoor game. The game moves at a faster pace than traditional baseball. There is less time for the base runner to get to first while the fielder fields the ball; yet the fielder

has less time to field to field the ball. Where does the name softball come from? It was given to the game in 1926, because the ball was soft. Despite its name the ball is not soft at all. The earliest known softball game was played in Chicago, Illinois on Thanksgiving day, 1887. The batting order must be fixed at the start of the game, and the players may not bat out of order.

Why is the softball ball yellow. It is yellow because it is more visible when hitting and catching. The Wilson Pioneered optic yellow ball was adapted by the NFCA in 1999. Other teams continued using the white ball that was used previously since the early 90's.

Softball to some people means learning how to play as a team and finding friendships in your teammates and learning how to work hard and communicate with others and cheering on your teammates and picking them up when they feel down.

How does softball affect people? It can help you stay in shape and makes you want to go to school and makes you stay active in school.
