9. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Superintendent Lovato updated the Board on summer school. He said this year new things are being tried, funded by ESSER funds. He shared the Junior/Senior High School is using a new format.

Superintendent Lovato is still learning about the FAMLI leave. He said the district will have to abide by the rules and it will be important for the district to follow them. The district will have until January to decide what they will be doing. Director Leyba said she has had several conversations regarding this and she understands the employer must have something better in place that is equal to or better than FMLA for employees. There are many different interpretations. Director Backes said there is a recorded webinar regarding this matter.

Superintendent Lovato shared the contractor that will install the new gym floor informed him today they are backed up and will not be here as planned. They don't have a beginning date yet.

The HVAC installation is on schedule and will begin the beginning of June.

Director Leyba asked for clarification on why TTA students will sit separate from La Junta Junior/Senior High school students at graduation. Superintendent Lovato explained they are two separate schools and the parents actually requested only one graduation occur.

Director Ayala asked about the bus barn construction progress. Superintendent Lovato said finishing items are occurring. Interior offices and bathrooms are being completed by our maintenance crew and he said it will depend on their workload for how long it will take to complete. Director Ayala stated it was requested at the Meet and Confer that TTA students get their basketball courts back. Superintendent Lovato said the buses will be off the courts before fall.

Director Leyba said Superintendent Lovato is the Board's only employee and asked if it is his job to keep on top of construction projects. He said it is the director of the department to handle that.

12. BOARD COMMENTS

- ✓ Superintendent Lovato clarified there is a bill that will help people get licensed. The bill will give an alternate pathway besides the PRAXIS test. Director Bickel asked if there is anyone that can't take the test due to financial issues. Superintendent Lovato said typically not and at times Title II funds have been used to help. Director Derbigny said there are booklets to help prepare for the test. She said it is a hard test for people who aren't prepared to be a teacher.
- ✓ Director Leyba would like to thank the community and families for allowing the Board to be active in their child's education. She said she isn't on social media as much as she used to be, but enjoys seeing the photos of students. It is nice to see all of the things the district is doing for our students. She said it is a good feeling to celebrate the group moving through on Sunday.
- ✓ Director Backes said congratulations to all students. She said it has been a good year compared to the last two that we've had. She said there is a lot to celebrate and congratulated the Seniors and the FBLA students. Director Backes said she would love to have a more formal finance report that shows the Board very detailed information. She would like an authentic financial report starting fresh this fiscal year. She would like to see year to year comparisons that would help the Board make financial decisions. She would also like follow through to see when purchases occur. She said one of the Boards biggest jobs is the financial health of the district.
- ✓ Directory Derbigny agreed with Director Backes and asked for a more user friendly report. She would also like as a Board to be able to keep up with student achievement and parental involvement. She said with all the students in the summer school program and literacy program she feels the district needs to be more involved.
- Director Levba said she did share an idea of having breakfast with the Board in the past.
- ✓ Director Ayala said she keeps hearing from the community of having the Board meetings to be live on social media. She would like the district to actively pursue that. She thanked the teachers in the audience for their hard work.
