- Director Leyba said she thought graduation was really fun this year. She said the speeches got a little bit dark but we have been tested recently by local and national events. She said there are issues we have to work through and find better support for but overall we count our blessings.
- ✓ Director Derbigny shared the Democratic Party is hosting a fun, family event this Saturday, May 28 at La Junta City Park from 12:00-3:00 p.m. There will be face painting, bounce houses, food and music. She asked for anyone interested to come and enjoy. There will also be speakers in attendance. Director Leyba pointed out that she asked Director Derbigny to discuss this event as one of the speakers in attendance will be Kathy Plommer, who is running for the at-large seat for the Colorado State Board of Education and feels this might be something the Board members would be interested in hearing.
