6. FINANCIAL REPORT

Superintendent Lovato presented the financial report to the Board. He shared a revenue report and stated all funds revenues are all aligned with the budget. The state revenues from June have not yet been entered into the system, which will make the revenues closer to \$12.5 million. Superintendent Lovato said the he and the business office staff are working diligently to clean things up in the system. He explained the budget codes to the Board. Superintendent Lovato said the revenues and expenses are trending well. Director Backes asked if the report they received is for the last fiscal year. Superintendent Lovato said this report covers January 1 to June 30. Director Derbigny inquired if all errors in the system have been cleaned up. Superintendent Lovato said they are not, however, it is being worked on daily. Director Derbigny asked for a more condensed report with a budget code key so the Board can better understand the report. Director Ayala asked if anyone is helping Superintendent Lovato with the financials. He said the business office staff are helping, as well as the district auditor. **FINANCIAL REPORT APPROVED AS PRESENTED**

8. SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT AND RECOMMENDATIONS

Superintendent Lovato updated the Board regarding the ongoing HVAC project. He shared he had a meeting this week with TRANE and the project is on schedule and will be complete in time for students to return.

The swimming pool roof is being re-roofed right now. After the recent rain, a new leak was discovered in the gym lobby. Those leaks are being also being addressed.

A gas line was hit while boring for conduit at the bus barn location last week. The district had the line located before work began. The line has been repaired. Superintendent Lovato said the district is currently looking for contractors to complete the finish work in the interior of the bus barn.

The Colorado Association of School Boards (CASB) recently completed an audit on the district's online policy manual. Superintendent Lovato said a Board work session will be needed to review the results.

Director Ayala asked for the estimated completion date of the bus barn. Superintendent Lovato is hoping sometime in September. A fire panel and fire suppression system is also still needed. Director Ayala also asked when the buses will be off the basketball court and Superintendent Lovato explained they were moved a couple of weeks ago as well as the trees being watered and a berm installed at Orahood Park. He said the landscape maintenance at Orahood Park will become a work study project for Tiger Trades Academy students. Director Ayala reminded everyone of the contributions Mr. Ernie Orahood made to the community and wants to make sure the park that is named after him is taken care of. Superintendent Lovato also shared lines are being repainted on the basketball court, as well as pickle ball lines. Students will also have corn hole games to play. Director Ayala asked about the street access for buses and if that will happen. Superintendent Lovato said that is a huge financial cost and probably won't be happening in the near future. Director Ayala thanked Superintendent Lovato for getting the court cleared off and asked about the estimated time for playground equipment. Superintendent Lovato said he will take care of the elementary schools first and will most likely need to obtain grant monies for that purchase.

10. BOARD COMMENTS

✓ Superintendent Lovato introduced Mr. Nuschy as the Assistant Superintendent. Superintendent Lovato informed the Board that Mr. Nuschy will be sharing a monthly building update.

Mr. Nuschy said online registration opened on July 1 and in-person building registrations will still occur. The Primary and Intermediate Schools building registration will be held on August 4 from 10:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m. and the Junior/Senior High School and Tiger Trades Academy building registration will be on August 8 from 11:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. 7th Grade orientation will be held at the Junior/Senior High School on August 11 at 5:00 p.m.

All four buildings are implementing new frameworks for behavior and building relationships this year. The elementary schools will be using Capturing Kids Hearts. The focus of Capturing Kids Hearts is building relationships with students and colleges and creating a safe environment for learning and classrooms. The secondary schools will be implementing Responsibility-Centered Discipline (RCD) with the same outcomes expected. Mr. Nuschy said the schools are trying to get away from obedient discipline and having students participate in classroom expectations. The RCD program has a parent component as well. Both programs are innovation on communication and classroom procedures.

Director Derbigny asked Mr. Nuschy if he will report on all of the buildings at each meeting. Mr. Nuschy said he will. Director Ayala asked if the Board will still hear from the principals or will it just be Mr. Nuschy. Superintendent Lovato said the principals will attend quarterly, but Mr. Nuschy will report monthly. Director Ayala clarified that there won't be a district-wide registration and asked if there will be transportation and health tables at the elementary registrations. Superintendent Lovato said there would be as well as a mental health table. He also shared the buildings prefer registration at their own sites. Director Ayala wants to make sure people are aware of registration dates if they don't have computer access. Calls will go out.

- Director Derbigny asked if the district still has ESSER funds to spend. Superintendent Lovato said yes and we have to be very pointed on how to use the monies. She asked if some of the money could be used for school supplies. Superintendent Lovato said at the beginning of the pandemic he was able to purchase school supplies, but now is not able to due to people not being in quarantine. Mr. Nuschy said there are still supplies in stock. She also asked about where the district should be on the state accountability clock. Superintendent Lovato said the district will be looking at the state testing results when they are received.
- ✓ Director Ayala asked if there will be any public limitations to the buildings this year. Superintendent Lovato said he doesn't foresee any, however, the district will be monitoring access for safety. Director Ayala also clarified the roles for administration. Superintendent Lovato is also the Chief Financial Officer and Mr. Nuschy is also the Athletic Director.
