


Book-of-the-month!

Crunch is a hot-pink, nonthreatening dinosaur. An

unseen narrator gives readers a series of directions on how to interact with him, setting up an entertaining, interactive story experience. Larger lessons about how to relate to others lurk beneath the surface of this lighthearted tale. Since Crunch is shy, the narrator suggests that readers "be the first to say hello," but not too loudly. When Crunch is scared off, luring him back involves singing the "Happy Birthday" song. Young children get practice in using quiet, loud, and medium voices, introducing themselves, and employing good manners. In the end, readers are prompted to bid Crunch good night and demonstrate how to lie down and get ready to sleep.

Youth Basketball League registration for girls and boys in grades 3-6 is open.



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October 2018 COUNSELOR'S CORNER Heather Westbrook, David Payette School Counselors, South Ridge Elementary School October is National Bullying Prevention Month Here at South Ridge Elementary, and at all of our schools in Ridgefield, we are dedicated to raising awareness about the need to prevent bullying. Throughout the year, we focus on our 3 R's-Respect, Responsibility, and Resilience. Practicing the 3 R's means we are treating each other with kindness, and in turn, helps to prevent bullying. To kick off National Bullying Prevention Month, each student will sign their name on an orange ribbon and then tie their ribbon on a fence for all to see. The fence will be a visible reminder that we believe no one should ever experience bullying. The PTA will also have students do the "Purple Hands Pledge" by cutting out purple hands, signing them, and pledging that they will not use their hands or words to hurt themselves or others. The hands will be displayed around the school. Finally, schools will take part in Unity Day on October 24th. Unity Day is part of National Bullying Prevention Month that calls for everyone to wear orange to show we're against bullying and for kindness, acceptance, and inclusion. Bullying Prevention in the classroom... School Counselors will be teaching lessons in the classroom about kindness and bullying prevention. In grades 3 & 4, students will be receiving a series of lessons on how to recognize bullying, how to report it, how to refuse it, and on the important role of a bystander. In 2nd grade this month, students will learn the definition of bullying and what they can do if they are a victim or if they witness it. In kindergarten and 1st grade, students will be receiving lessons on problem solving and conflict resolution and also on academic skills such as listening to learn, focusing, and following directions. What is bullying? Bullying is a conscious, deliberate, aggressive, and repeated behavior by one or more people that is intended to harm others. It involves a real or perceived imbalance of power, such as physical strength, access to embarrassing information, or popularity to control or harm others. Bullying behaviors happen more than once or have the *potential* to happen more than once. What should you do if you are being bullied? Speak up Tell an adult at home and/or at school. Know that you have the right to be safe What can you do if you see bullying happen? Do not join in. Strong people stand up for themselves Tell an adult at home and/or school. the strongest Help the student being bullied get away from the situation. e stand up for Let them know that they don't deserve to be bullied. others.. - Unknown Know that reporting bullying is not tattling.




