5th grade Conservation Club

Conservation Club for 5th grade starts November 9th

Three years ago 5th grade students participated in a Renewable Energy Leadership Lab sponsored by the Bonneville Environmental Foundation. We examined the plastic trash problem and created some possible solutions. Then a select group of students took part in the regional KidWind Challenge on March 9th 2019. The group worked for 6 weeks meeting twice a week to build a wind turbine. Team S.A.S. Serious About Science won 1st place in the Elementary division.

Two years ago we had multiple 5th grade teams, as well as some middle school teams ready to compete when COVID canceled our event. For 2020/21 we held our meetings fully virtually and competed at the National Challenge virtually. Our National team was awarded the Spirit of KidWind award. Last year we hosted a regional challenge at Liberty. Two winning teams went to Nationals in San Antonio. Our Elementary team, "Emo Ducks" won a 1st place in the Hydro-power challenge at Nationals and our Middle School team, "JamJom" had a great experience.

We hope to qualify a team again this year and go to Nationals in New Orleans May 22nd -25th. Dates of Conservation Club meetings will be after school Wednesdays starting November 9th (11/9, 11/16, 11/30, 12/7, 12/14, 1/4, 1/11, 1/18, 2/1, 2/8, 2/15, 2/22, 3/1, 3/8, 3/9*, 3/11*, 3/15, 3/22, 4/12, 4/19, 4,26, 5/3) Our last meeting on May 3rd will be a showcase held after school for families and staff at Liberty. March 9th is an extra day for challenge prep. and Saturday, March 11th is our Regional KidWind Challenge at Liberty.

Students will stay after school once a week and learn science concepts and how to use scientific tools, measures, and technology. Space will be limited, and the deadline to sign up is November 4th. Attendance is crucial, so please take a close look at the proposed meeting dates. Students will need to be picked up by a parent no later than 5:45 PM in Portable 1. We meet most Wednesday evenings.


