## Warm Weather Clothing Reminder

Believe it or not, the weather will change! As it warms up, summer clothing emerges from our closets. Please ensure that your child wears sensible clothes to school. Below are some simple reminders that may help:

A sweater, sweatshirt or lightweight coat may still be needed as the weather can change quickly from warm to chilly. Remind your student to check the playground for discarded sweaters, etc., since they are usually taken off during play at recess time.

- \* The length of skirts and shorts should be lower than the child's fingertips when extended downward.
- \* **Flip-flops, sandals and shoes with heels are not appropriate** for play, recess or PE. We have had students sustain injuries due to these types of footwear.
- \* Halter tops and skinny straps on shirts are not permitted.
- \* Shirts should be long enough to cover student's midriff at all times.

Please do not allow your student to wear flip-flops to school! They are not designed for safe play.



Encouraging comfortable, appropriate clothing makes play and PE more fun for everyone.

### NOT RETURNING NEXT YEAR?

If you find that you are not returning to our school next year, please let the office know as soon as possible.



We are busy planning for next year at this time. It is helpful to be aware of our enrollment and know the class in which to place all students. This is the same for all schools.

Once you know which school your student will attend, please register as soon as possible at the new school. The new school will then request your student's records from us.

If you do not return, we will miss you and wish you the best at your new school.

### Sunscreen at School

During the warmer weather, you may wish to send sunscreen with your student to protect their skin from the sun/ultraviolet rays. If you send sunscreen, please label the container with your student's name. They must be able to apply it themselves and keep it in their backpack.



Under no circumstance should sunscreen be shared with other students.

### Preparing for Testing

Your student has probably mentioned various assessments that they participate in throughout the year. As the end of the school year nears, more assessments are conducted.

Some tips to help your student during this time include:

- \* Talk with your child about the assessments, let them know they are an important part of learning and that they provide information regarding their learning progress;
- \* Students should get a good night's rest;
- \* Ensure your student has breakfast; and
- \* Tell your student that you believe in them and know they will do their best.

### Stay Hydrated!

It is an important health reminder to keep your student hydrated at all times. Feel free to send a water bottle/container with your student. The container must have a lid to prevent spillage in the classroom or other areas of the school. Please note that we have fountains which allow students to refill their bottles.

### Don't Let Head Lice Interfere with Your Child's Opportunity to Learn and Achieve in School

Missing school puts a child behind in learning.

It is very important you check your child's head weekly for signs of head lice, and that when you are notified that your child's head needs to be treated you begin to work immediately. Once you have started the treatment process, and combed out all nits (small eggs), your child is able to return to school. You will need to continue to comb out the nits and check your child's hair until it is all clear for 4-6 weeks.

Head lice are a small insect living on the human scalp and feed on blood. Lice do not jump, hop or fly; they are spread only by direct contact. Lice hatch from small eggs (nits) about every ten (10) days. A live louse matures and lays eggs every two (2) weeks. When nits are present, the lice have been on your child's hair for some time.

Remember, just about everyone can get lice at some point. Please be watchful and help your child as well as others with the above-referenced suggestion.

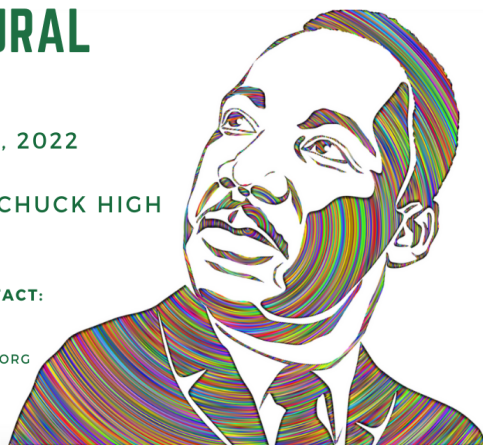

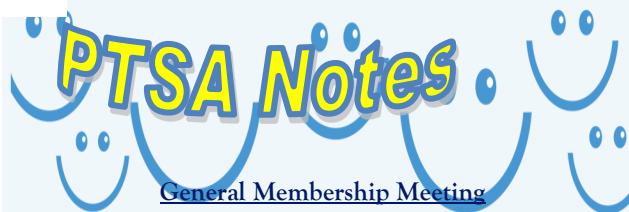
