I began my position at Marshall in December and am excited to be here. I have been welcomed warmly by staff, students and parents alike. I have a lot of experience in this area.



# Girls on the Run provides: Power, Purpose and Potential


This is an opportunity for girls to recognize their strengths while building connections with others.
