From the Principal:

Hello Pinewood Families,

Welcome back from Winter Break and Happy 2023! I hope you had a wonderful time with your family and friends during the holidays. We are so pleased to have our Panthers back in school again and are off to a busy start to this New Year!

January is a time for taking stock and setting goals. Most people make some type of New Year's resolution. Then two weeks later many realize that they haven't followed through. Kids are no different. Why not make this the year that your children learn how to achieve the goals they set for themselves?

When your children set a goal, help them choose one they can reach in a short time frame. Encourage them to be specific. For instance, "Be smart" is too broad. "Learn multiplication facts," however, can be observed and measured.

Then help your children follow these five steps for achieving the goal:

1. **State the goal.** "My goal is to learn my multiplication facts." They should write it down and post it where they will see it.
2. **Plan how to meet the goal.** "I will make flashcards and study them for 15 minutes every night. I will ask Mom to quiz me on Fridays."
3. **Talk about the goal with others.** This builds commitment to the goal. Your children should tell their teachers what they plan to do.
4. **Do each step in the plan, one at a time.** If problems come up, talk about possible solutions. Perhaps they are too tired after doing his homework each night to review their flashcards. Maybe they could study them in the mornings while they eat breakfast instead.
5. **Motivate and celebrate.** Praise your children for their effort each step of the way. "I am proud of you for studying your multiplication facts this morning." And when they achieve their goal, celebrate how their hard work paid off!

In January, our students will have the opportunity to take the iReady math and iReady reading diagnostic tests again. These tests are on the computer and adapt as students answer questions. So please encourage your student(s) to go slow and double check their work so their instructional pathways are accurate, and our staff will do the same.

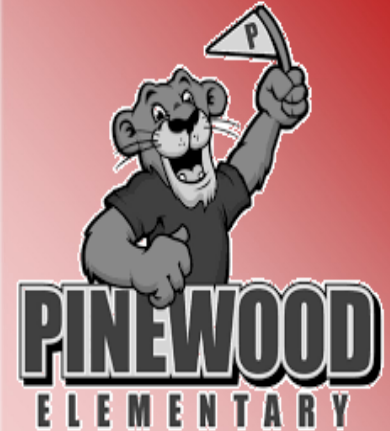

ABSENCES and TARDIES

Please call the **ATTENDANCE LINE** at **360.965.1301**

If your student will be absent or late arriving to school for any reason, please call the attendance line. If not answered this line goes directly to voice mail, which makes it available 24 hours per day, 7 days per week. When you know in advance that your child has a medical or dental appointment that will keep them out of school or arrive to school late, leave a message at this line. We are able to take the information in advance. If you do not leave a message and your child is not at school, an automated call will go out to attempt contacting you to ensure that your child is safe. Your child will be marked unexcused if contact is not made..

Please help us by calling in by 9:00 am. When your child is absent, please call or send a note with your child to excuse the absence within 3 days. Pre-arranged absences for family reasons need prior approval by the principal, provided that the absence will not adversely affect your child's progress in school. Absence approval forms are available in the school office. If you child arrives at 9:25 or later, please check in at the office for a tardy slip to minimize disturbance in the classroom.

How Does Your Child Go Home?

There may be days when your child is uncertain of the manner by which they are expected to leave school. Some days a child may be picked up by a parent or other adult and other days they may ride the bus or walk. This may cause some confusion especially as we see the change of weather . Please help your child know in advance what is expected of them at the end of the school day. It may be a good idea to create a plan with your child, reinforcing each morning how they are to get home. Of course, emergencies do happen. When the plan changes during the day, the office is happy to send a parent message to the student by 3:00 PM. Our goal is to ensure that your child returns home safely and as quickly as possible.

Student Messages

We are receiving many messages for students concerning end of the day plans. In order to avoid interruption of instructional time, we ask that plans for after school be discussed before school each day. Please keep end of the day messages for emergency changes only!

Winter Weather Bulletin

Please review the winter weather bulletins linked below so you are prepared in the event transportation and/or school schedules are impacted due to the weather: [Parent/Family Bulletin](#)

The District is prepared in the event ice or snow creates conditions that are unsafe for buses and other vehicles traveling on the roadways. Transportation staff starts physical road checks at 3:00 am. The Transportation Director reviews staff reports and contacts other school districts in the region. A report is then made to the Superintendent who will make the decision on whether schools will start late or be canceled. The decision is based on many factors including the morning report from the Transportation Director, road conditions, the forecast, and the safety of students and staff.

If there is a change to the school schedule the District will notify families and staff through multiple communication platforms by 6:00 am. The information will also be posted on local news channels and the District website at www.ms25.org.

Family Access in Skyward (<http://family.marysville.wa-k12.net>)

Family Access is a great way for parents and guardians to access your child's grades, view attendance, discipline, meal account activity, and update your personal information such as phone numbers or emergency contacts. In some cases, the district will post forms in Family Access that require viewing and/or a signature. Family Access is part of our student data system. Each account is private and viewable only to those who have approved credentials and a login and password. For the protection of our students, this cannot be done over the phone

- **Setting up a Family Access Account:** In order to set up an account for Family Access, you will need to have an email in your child(rens) records in the data system. This is typically added when you enrolled your child(ren) in school but can become outdated over time. Follow these steps to get connected:
- If you have not provided an email, please contact your child(rens) school office and provide them with parent/guardian email addresses.
- If you have an email but do not have your login information or you need to create an account, go to <https://www.ms25.org/o/district/page/skyward-family-access--38> and choose Family/Student login under the resource column.
- Click on the "forgot username or password" link and follow the steps.
- You can also connect to the Family Access App once you have an established account. Search "Family Access" on your smart phone App store.

PAY ONLINE

Marysville School District's Point of Sale system has made it easy for families to pay for lunches, field trips, fines etc. without a transaction fee. This system is called Touch-Base and utilizes the same login as assigned to you for Skyward Family Access.

Please do not bring your dog to school when picking up your students. Only certified service animals are permitted on District properties.

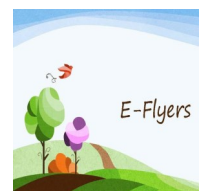

DO YOU WANT TO VOLUNTEER?

All volunteers must meet the following requirements in order to be eligible to volunteer:

Per the Governor's vaccine mandate, all school volunteers are required to show proof of vaccination.

Volunteers must complete their volunteer packet, including criminal background check (every 2 years). Volunteer applications are available online - click [HERE](#).

There is an email set up for volunteers to send in their application (volunteer@msd25.org). Since vaccination status will need to be included with the paperwork, it will go directly to the COVID department for processing.

Volunteers will be allowed to work in classrooms at the discretion of the teacher and must follow all DOH Health and Safety Guidelines for schools. Additionally, there may be limits on the number of daily volunteers allowed in a classroom based on physical distancing requirements.

We hope that this is just one of many steps toward a broader sense of normalcy in our schools. It will be great to have parents and families back in our buildings!

Bienvenido de regreso de las vacaciones de invierno y feliz 2023! Espero la haya pasado bien con su familia y amigos durante las vacaciones. Estamos muy contentos de tenerlos de Vuelta en nuestra escuela. Enero es un momento para hacer balance y establecer metas. La mayoría de la gente hace algún tipo de resolución de Año Nuevo. Luego, dos semanas después, muchos se dan cuenta de que no han cumplido. Los niños no son diferentes. ¿Por qué no hacer de este el año en que sus hijos aprendan cómo lograr las metas que se propusieron? 2. Planifique cómo alcanzar la meta. "Haré tarjetas didácticas y las estudiaré durante 15 minutos todas las noches. Le pediré a mamá que me haga preguntas los viernes".
3. Hablar de la meta con los demás. Esto genera compromiso con la meta. Sus hijos deben decirles a sus maestros lo que planean hacer.
4. Realice cada paso del plan, uno a la vez. Si surgen problemas, hable sobre soluciones posibles. Tal vez estén demasiado cansados después de hacer su tarea todas las noches para revisar sus tarjetas didácticas. Tal vez podrían estudiarlos por las mañanas mientras desayunan.
5. Motívale y celebra. Elogie a sus hijos por su esfuerzo en cada paso del camino. "Estoy orgulloso de ti por estudiar las tablas de multiplicar esta mañana". Y cuando logren su objetivo, celebre cómo valió la pena su arduo trabajo!
