Science – **3 Credits** – Biology, Chemistry, and Physics OR Biology, Physical Sciences, and 3rd Science credit (Science class or CTE)

Social Studies – **3 Credits** – World History, US History, Government, and Economics

 - Cum Laude – 3.50 – 3.79

FINANCIAL AID

- FAFSA – Free Application for Federal Student Aid
- Opens up October 1, 2023 (for Seniors)
- Deadline to apply is March 1, 2024

Off-Campus Programs

- Career & Technical Education (CTE)
- Dual Enrollment
- Work-Based Learning/Co-op (Senior Year Only)
- REQUIREMENTS:
 - Application and Permission Slip
 - Minimum 2.0 GPA and good attendance
 - Prerequisites may be needed
 - Criteria for dual enrollment
- GRADING: With the exception of Co-op, off campus programs earn a letter grade on transcript and are factored into GPA

- Classes offered at Midland Public Schools, Coleman High School, Meridian High School, GMCA, and Delta
- Based on availability and meeting scheduling needs

- Careers in agriculture, natural resources, animal science, plant science, agribusiness, and leadership
- Focus on projects in lab, greenhouse, and animal barn
- Potential to earn college credit
- Offered at Coleman Community Schools



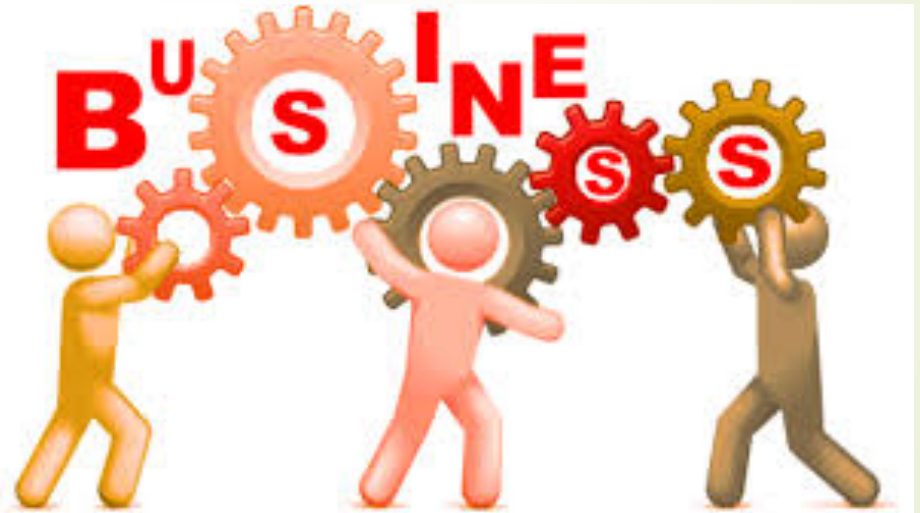
AUTOMOTIVE TECHNOLOGY

- Automobile care, maintenance, and critical elements of safety
- NATEF National Skills
 - Electrical, suspension and steering
 - Engine performance
 - Brakes
- Earn up to 18 articulated college credits at Delta
- Midland Public Schools - Dow High



BUSINESS ADMINISTRATION

- Learn more about human resources, entrepreneurship, marketing, advertising, and management
- Midland Public Schools - Dow High School



COSMETOLOGY



- ▶ Cosmetology classes offered through Bay Arenac Career Center and Bayshire Beauty Academy in Bay City
- ▶ Two-year program that starts in August 2023
- ▶ Work towards earning 1500 required hours to take certification exams

CULINARY ARTS

- Hands on experience where students learn in a commercial kitchen
- Students learn about nutrition, safety in preparing food as well as catering events
- Offered at Coleman High School



GREATER MICHIGAN CONSTRUCTION ACADEMY

- Careers in carpentry, electrical, welding, and HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning)
- Hands on learning
- Earn credentials from National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) and possibly college credit



HEALTH CARE TECHNOLOGY

- Career interest in the healthcare field such as nurse, doctor, x-ray technician, sonographer, dentist, etc.
- Potential to earn college credit at Delta
- Start in 11th grade
- Midland Public Schools – Midland High School



Dual Enrollment

- Opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school
- Criteria for eligibility...uses PSAT, ACT, SAT, or Accuplacer Scores along with grades and attendance
- Classes offered at Delta, SVSU, CMU, Northwood, Davenport, and Mid-Michigan Community College, and beyond
- Tuition covered up to \$725/class
- Transportation responsibility of student
- **Failing a class, dropping a class, or being dropped from a class requires reimbursement to BC for tuition and fees**
- Dual enrollment classes earn a letter grade on transcript and are factored into GPA, unless otherwise declared
- Starting college transcript. No more than 10 college courses.



Bullock Creek Early College Program

- Program that allows you to earn both high school and college credit (different from dual enrollment opportunity)
- All college classes must be taken through Delta
- Defer your diploma for one year and take a 5th year of high school (all 5th year classes at Delta)
- Opportunity to earn up to 60 college credits at the end of your 5th year
- Application process and requirements for admittance will be covered at Parent and Student Informational Meeting – following this meeting
