English – 4 Credits – English 9, English 10, English 11, and English 12

Math – 4 Credits – Algebra I, Geometry, Algebra II, and Math/Math Related Class
Senior Year

Science – *3 Credits* – Biology, Chemistry, and Physics OR Biology, Physical Sciences, and 3rd Science credit (Science class or CTE)

Social Studies – 3 Credits – World History, US History, Government, and Economics

Visual, Performing, or Applied Arts (VPAA) – 1 Credit

World Language – 2 Credits (or 1 World Language credit and additional VPAA credit)

Health - .5 Credit

Physical Education - .5 Credit

- In the event that there are ties based on GPA (formula of GPA combined with state approved assessment-SAT) will be used
- Latin Honor System
 - Summa Cum Laude 3.99 and Above
 - Magna Cum Laude 3.8 3.98
 - Cum Laude 3.50 3.79
- Formula determines Graduation Speakers, Tri-Valley All Academic, and TV-5 Best and Brightest

- REQUIREMENTS:
 - Application and Permission Slip
 - Minimum 2.0 GPA and good attendance
 - Prerequisites may be needed
 - Criteria for dual enrollment
 - Provide own transportation **
- GRADING: With the exception of Co-op, off campus programs earn a letter grade on transcript and are factored into GPA

Automobile care, maintenance, and critical elements



COSMETOLOGY



- Cosmetology classes offered through Bay Arenac Career Center and Bayshire Beauty Academy in Bay City
- Two-year program that starts in August 2023
- Work towards earning 1500 required hours to take certification exams
- "Senior Math"

GULINARY ARTS

- Hands on experience where students learn in a commercial kitchen
- Students learn about nutrition, safety in preparing food as well as catering events
- "Senior Math"
- Offered at Coleman High School



GREATER MICHIGAN CONSTRUCTION ACADEMY



- Careers in carpentry, electrical, welding, and HVAC (heating, ventilation and air conditioning)
- Hands on learning
- Earn credentials from National Center for Construction Education and Research (NCCER) and possibly college credit
- "Senior Math"

HEALTH CARE TECHNOLOGY

- Career interest in the healthcare field such as nurse, doctor, x-ray technician, sonographer, dentist, etc.
- Potential to earn college credit at Delta
- Typically Start in 11th grade
- Health Care Tech 2 can count for "Senior Math"
- Midland Public Schools Midland High School



Dual Enrollment

- Opportunity to earn college credit while still in high school
- Criteria for eligibility...uses PSAT or SAT Scores along with grades and attendance
- Classes offered at Delta, SVSU, CMU, Northwood, Davenport, and Mid-Michigan Community College, and beyond
- Tuition covered up to \$725/class
- Transportation responsibility of student.
- Failing or with drawing from a class requires reimbursement for tuition and fees to BC.
- Dual enrollment classes earn a letter grade on transcript and are factored into GPA, unless otherwise declared in writing prior to the start of the semester

Work Based Learning

- Senior Program
- Must have a specific number of credits (17) entering senior year
- Create a Portfolio Cover Letter, Resume, Letter of Recommendation, Transcript, Certificates, Awards
- Complete an application
- Packet of information/handbook available
- This is a pass/fail program. Credit (CR) is received towards graduation if successfully completed. Students WILL NOT receive a letter grade, which may affect their class standing
