**2. Public Comment**

- Moved up XII B Phill Mogen trip to New York and Washington DC. Phil thanked the board for its support. He reported they completed a successful trip to Washington DC. Carter Rengo, student, spoke about his experience. He explained the significance of the history of those who sacrificed for freedom, happiness of people who care about their freedom, and many of the sites they visited while in Washington DC. Corbin Onnen, student, spoke about New York City. Students went to the Edge, Joe's Pizza (pie), a Broadway show, Ellis Island (visited the museum and examined artifacts), Statue of Liberty, 911 Memorial, a subway ride that was pretty chaotic, Times Square, and took a trip over the Brooklyn Bridge.
  - Phil reported they had 49 travelers - 7 adults and 42 students who experienced flight delays, fond memories, and overall they experienced a great trip. He thanked the administrators and the school board for their support. Regarding future travel, Gina Mogen spoke about a request for next year. She and Leah Gagne have already led two successful trips to Europe. Their vision for the future is to have rotating trips over a three year plan. They would do an international trip, a domestic trip, and a service trip. For the service trip, they plan to begin planning for a spring 2024 service trip to Puerto Rico. Students will experience the culture and history while engaging in a sustainability project of at least 12 hours. The trip would be available to students in grades 6-8 with high school mentors also included. The cost is \$3,150, and they would like to begin fundraising. Board members asked questions about past fundraising and dates for the trip. Joe Ward commented on the phenomenal job the advisers have done and complimented the two student speakers.
