We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Hemlock Elementary School. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

At Hemlock Elementary School, our goal is for each child to achieve at least one year's growth in all core academic subject areas, as well as develop positive character traits within each child. In order to be more competitive with our neighboring districts, one of the key challenges we face is the need to increase our state achievement scores on state summative assessments, while at the same time working to reduce the achievement gap between our top 30% and bottom 30%. Although we are not a Focus or Priority School, it is important that we continually strive to close the achievement gap. Additionally, we are dedicated to address learning loss resulting from the pandemic.

We currently have interventions in place, through a highly structured MTSS program, to support our students that are performing below grade level in reading and math. In an effort to increase our student achievement, the principal and teachers will be actively involved in ongoing professional development, collaborative planning, and an improved teacher observation/evaluation process. Additionally, we will work to enhance our skills in the areas of differentiated instruction, technology integration, intervention strategies, and

best teaching practices. Hemlock Elementary will continue the use of a school-wide Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) system, as well as an increased focused on a whole child initiative. With the continued support of our parents and community members, we will achieve our goals.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL

All Young 5 and Kindergarten students attending Hemlock Public Schools are assigned to Hemlock Elementary since there is not another specialized school in the district serving Young 5s, Kindergarten, as well as an Early Childhood Special Education program. Hemlock Elementary is a school that accepts Schools of Choice students that desire a premier alternative option per the application process.

A BRIEF DESCRIPTION OF OUR SCHOOL

Hemlock Elementary is located in Hemlock, Michigan. It is home to approximately 120 students, in Young 5s, Kindergarten, and Early Childhood Special Education. Hemlock Elementary is a targeted assistance Title I school and offers the following programs: Multi-Tiered Systems of Support (MTSS), special education inclusion, peer-to-peer support, before and after school care, summer school, robotics, physical education, music, STEAM, library, and nutrition. Student enrollment has steadily increased over the last five years.
