We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER), which provides key information on the 2021-22 educational progress for Hemlock High School. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2021-22 school year, schools were identified based on previous years' performance using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that had at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2021-22. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that had a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state in 2021-22. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance was in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or had a graduation rate at or below 67% in 2021-22. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school has not been given one of these labels.

Hemlock High School prepares students for their futures. We have placed a focus on giving students experiences that will help them in their desired career field and or prepare our students for a College experience. This Hemlock High School hosts an Early College program. This status allows the students enrolled in this program the opportunity to receive 20+ transferable college credits in their junior and senior years. In addition, these students attend a 5th year at Delta College at no cost to them with the ability to reach an associate's degree or additional transferable credits.

Hemlock High School provides education to students in 9th-12th grade. Programs provided at the school include online learning using Edgenuity and Michigan Virtual programming for credit recovery summer school students. Students are assigned to the grade depending on the credits needed to earn Graduation per the Michigan merit curriculum.

1. We are currently in the implementation phase of the 3-5 year plan for improvement in our schools' goals. Our school's goals are achieving college readiness for all students in reading and math on the SAT.

- 2. Hemlock High School has Hemlock Early Middle college in the building. This gives students an opportunity to receive up to 60 free college credits earned through a partnership with Delta college. Many students also elect to attend the Saginaw Career Complex. This education is focused on CTE and getting students hands on work experience and education.
- 3. Hemlock High Schools follows the Michigan Merit Curriculum.
- 4. Students at Hemlock High School annually take the SAT test in their junior year. This is a nationally normed test that colleges use for college admittance. Hemlock Scored above the state average this past school year.
- 5. This school year we elected to do a Hybrid conference offering a Virtual option along with a face to face option. We had 53% of our parents participate in at least one of the conference options.
