Pre-1944

Lloyd G. Scoville

Binghamton Central

Played football, baseball and ran track at Binghamton Central--all star in football. Attended Allentown Prep and Colgate University where he played football; he also played semi-pro football on First Ward (Binghamton) team.

William H. Hoysradt

Binghamton Central

Played football and baseball at Binghamton Central High School--Bill was an all star in football. Bill also played semi-pro football for the First Ward (Binghamton) team.

1944-1964

Ken Wilson

Binghamton North

Played football and baseball while at Binghamton North. Started at halfback for three years. Scored the touchdown to give Binghamton North its first league championship in 1947. Played and coached semi-pro teams for touring Griffis Air Force Base team.

Ray Osterhout, Jr.

Windsor Central School

Sectional champion cross country runner. Later attended Syracuse University where he had a highly successful career running in NCAA races.

Don Tomanek (deceased)

Johnson City

Played football at Johnson City High School's undefeated teams of 1948, 49, 50. Played football at Colgate University where he started every game. Don also was on the Colgate wrestling team.

Robert Francismone

Ithaca High School

Three time Sectional wrestling champion. Wrestled in college at Cornell University and Ithaca College. Bob was co-captain at Ithaca College where he was also a 4-I Conference Champion and National Qualifier. Bob currently coaches at Paul Smith's College.

1964-1974

John Reid

Chenango Valley

Played basketball, baseball and ran cross country while at Chenango Valley. Sectional champion in cross country and all-league in basketball and baseball. Attended Colgate University where he was all-American in baseball and also played basketball. Played baseball professionally for the Montreal Expos.

Mike Barlow

Milford Central School

Played basketball and baseball at Milford Central Central School where he starred in both sports. Attended Syracuse University where he played both varsity basketball and baseball. Played major league baseball for the St. Louis Cardinals, Houston Astros, California Angels and Toronto Blue Jays. Mike played on the American League West championship California Angels team of 1979.

Tom Parr

Ithaca High School

Tom played football and baseball at Ithaca High School. All STAC in football where in one eight game season he set a record for offense by amassing a total of 1,437 yards. Attended Colgate University where he played and starred on the football field. Tom is a member of the Colgate University Athletic Hall of Fame.

Ray Stanton

Binghamton North High School

Ray played football at North where he was quarterback. He was selected as an all-star for two years. Ray attended Auburn University and Cortland State. Ray helped found the Triple Cities Jets semiprofessional football team.

Elmira Free Academy
