Michael O'Connell and Joan McGranaghan - co-chairpersons

Induction into the Hall of Fame will be March 4, 1983 at half-time of the Sectional basketball game at the Broome County Arena.

Coaches

Gordy O'Reilly- deceased

Coached at Binghamton North from 1947-62.

Eddie Pierce - deceased

Coached at Ithaca High School 1928-1945. Eddie also served as athletic director at Ithaca.

Robert A. Deyo

Coached at Binghamton Central High School and also served as faculty manager of athletics at Binghamton Central.

Charlie Sanders

Coached at Stamford Central School from 1948-1973. Charlie also served as athletic director.

Tom O'Neill-deceased

Coached at Walton Central School from 1929-1951. Tom also served as athletic director and high school principal. Walton's new junior-senior high school building is named in his honor.

ATHLETES

Pre- 1943

Charles Swart - Oneonta High School

Played football, basketball, baseball and ran track in high school. Team leading scorer in basketball. Later attended Manlius Prep and Syracuse U. Played both pro basketball and baseball.

Fred Deinhardt - Binghamton North

Played both football and baseball at Binghamton North where he was named to the league all-star teams.

1943-1953

John "Bucky" O'Donnell - Binghamton North High School

Played basketball, golf and ran track while at Binghamton North. Bucky was named all-league in basketball. Later attended Alfred University where he started in every game for four years and graduated as the all-time leading scorer. Bucky also served for 25 years as a basketball official in the Triple Cities area.

Vince Garbarino - deceased- Binghamton North High School

Played football, basketball and baseball while at North High School. Earned nine letters at North as North won conference championships in football, basketball and baseball in 47-48. Vince started on all three teams. He was all-conference and all-central NYS in both football and baseball.

Joe Garbarino - Binghamton North High School

Played football, basketball and baseball while at North. League and conference all-star as well as team captain for football, basketball and baseball while at Binghamton North. Earned 8 varsity letters and elected best athlete of his graduating class. Later attended State University at Binghamton where he set scoring records in basketball and was team captain.

1953-1963

Tom Major - Horseheads High School

Played and starred in football, basketball and baseball while at Horseheads. Tom was named all-league in basketball while in high school. Later attended and graduated from State College at Cortland where he starred in football and baseball.

David R. Chichester - Whitney Point High School

Sectional champion in discus and holds school and conference records in discus and shot put. Outstanding football player who attended Syracuse University on scholarship and graduated with high honors.

Dick King - Binghamton North High School

Played and starred in football, basketball and baseball while at Binghamton North High School. All-conference in all three sports and all-state in football. He was the Evening Press athlete of the year in 1959.

Richard "Rob" Gardner - Binghamton Central High School

Star pitcher in high school. Later signed by the Minnesota Twins and pitched for several major league teams including the New York Mets and the New York Yankees.

1963-73

Tim Jenks - Chenango Forks High School

Starred in football, wrestling and track while in high school. Three time sectional champion in wrestling and all-league in football. Tim gained almost 1,600 yards as a senior. Tim later attended Syracuse University where he was a wrestling stand-out.

Paul Anderson (now Paul Anderson-Winchell) -Susquehanna Valley High School

Starred in football and basketball while at Susquehanna Valley. Paul gained almost 1,600 yards in his senior year while a teammate gained over 1,000 yards. Paul attended college at Brown U.

Tom Snickenberger (now Tom Snickenberger, M.D.) Ithaca High School

Played football, ice hockey and baseball while at Ithaca High School. Tom was an all-star in both both football and baseball. In ice hockey scored six hat tricks in his high school years. Tom attended Dartmouth College where he played and starred in both football and baseball.

Maxine Shackelton - Walton High School

Played field hockey. Was a sectional champion in vaulting and field exercise in gymnastics. All-league in basketball and softball. Co-holder of outstanding athlete of her graduating class. Attended Lambuth College in Jackson, Tenn. where she played basketball for four years.

Marlene Shackelton - Walton High School- (now Marlene Shackelton Ray)

Played all girls' sports at Walton. Sectional champion in gymnastics in both beam and bar. Co-holder of outstanding athlete of her graduating class as voted by her classmates. The Shackeltons are sisters of John Shackelton who is already a member of the Section IV Hall of Fame.
