

The Section IV Hall of Fame is an honor accorded to coaches and athletes who have demonstrated excellence in scholastic sports. Each year at the Sectional Basketball Championships the new members of the Hall of Fame are inducted. The following men will be honored on March 6, 1982 at the Arena in Binghamton:

Pre 1942

George Boldman (Owego)

4 years varsity football, Owego....College football at Gettysburg College and University of Southern California

Ted Griffin (Binghamton)

4 letter man at Binghamton High School....won first letter when he was 13 years old...played his college sports at University of Notre Dame....captain of the tennis team

Leland "Bunky" Morris (Norwich)

3 sport standout at Norwich High School....played on Norwich's undefeated, untied, unscored upon football team of 1937...played college football at Syracuse University, both offense and defense at 5'6" and 145 lbs.....also punted.....in one game against Columbia he punted the ball 79 yards and then after a fumble won the game with a 32-yard drop-kick field goal....in another Syracuse game he punted 12 times for 603 yards

1942-1952

William Haskins (Binghamton Central)

Sectional record holder in dash events....outstanding football player....college football at Syracuse University

Fran Angeline (Union-Endicott)

4 sport letter man at U-E....all-conference and all-state his junior and senior years....captain of the 1951 Tiger football team....attended college at Colgate University....captain of the Red Raiders in 1955....today coaches at Union-Endicott High School....New York State Coach of the Year....National High School Coach of the Year

1952-1962

John Shackelton (Walton)

Sus. League all-star in both baseball and basketball.... averaged over 20 points and rebounds per game in his junior and senior seasons....selected all-state in basketball 1967-68....attended McNeese State University....starred on the basketball team

Jerry Bell (Homer)

Outstanding high school wrestler....after high school a winner in the Pan American games....made the World Team....finalist for the United States Olympic team in 1968

John Durkee (Homer)

3 sport standout at Homer (Football, basketball and baseball).... John holds practically all basketball scoring records at Homer

1962-1972

Tom Eryant (Owego)

Outstanding football and track man at Owego....holds school record run of 99 yards in football....holds school record in 220 dash (22.1 sec.)....played college football at Penn State and Ithaca College

Alan Klumpp (Windsor)

4 sport star at Windsor for four years....played on Windsor's undefeated, untied, unscored upon football team of 1963.... leading scorer on the basketball team for four years....held the school and Sectional records in track in 880 relay, 440 relay and shot put....all-Central New York State in baseball.... played college football at Colgate University....team captain in 1969....starred for the TC Jets....holds the honor of being the son of another member of the Hall of Fame, Merritt Klumpp, who is a member of the Coaches' Hall of Fame

Claude Poole (Ithaca)

State Wrestling champion 1965 and 1966....Claude was also a 3-year Windsor Tourney wrestling champion

Steve Webster (Ithaca)

Standout football and ice hockey player....in football Steve was New York State player of the year in 1970.... twice all-state and three times all-conference....played football at Syracuse University

Mike Johnston (Elmira Notre Dame)

played football, basketball and baseball....all-league in all three sports....in one game in 1963 Mike completed 14 straight passes....college football at Alfred University....Little All American....coached Elmira Notre Dame boys' basketball team to state championship in 1978

Tim Anderson (Susquehanna Valley)

played basketball, football and tennis at Susquehanna Valley.... first team all-STAC for two years in basketball....6th leading scorer in Section IV history-1,254 points....Tim holds almost all basketball records at Susquehanna Valley High School

Coaches Hall of Fame

Ross Shafer - deceased (Cortland)

twice president of Section IV Athletic Council....coached almost all sports at Cortland High School....Director of Athletics at Cortland High School for 38 years

Herbert C. Butts (New Berlin)

coached football, basketball, soccer and baseball at New Berlin High School for 41 years

Art Sharpstein (Binghamton Central and Chenango Valley)

highly successful basketball coach at Binghamton Central who then helped develop the athletic program at Chenango Valley High School

George Cancro (Newfield)

coached most sports at Newfield Central School for 36 years

Tom Guidus (Elmira Heights)

coach and athletic director at Elmira Heights High School for 32 years....past president of Section IV

Tony Drago (Oneonta)

coach and athletic director at Oneonta High School from 1956 to the present....Tony has coached three sectional championship basketball teams, one of which was undefeated, 1959-60....Tony has worked for Public High School Athletic Association....7 years on the Executive Committee....10 years on the Central Committee.... 10 years on the Section IV Executive Committee
