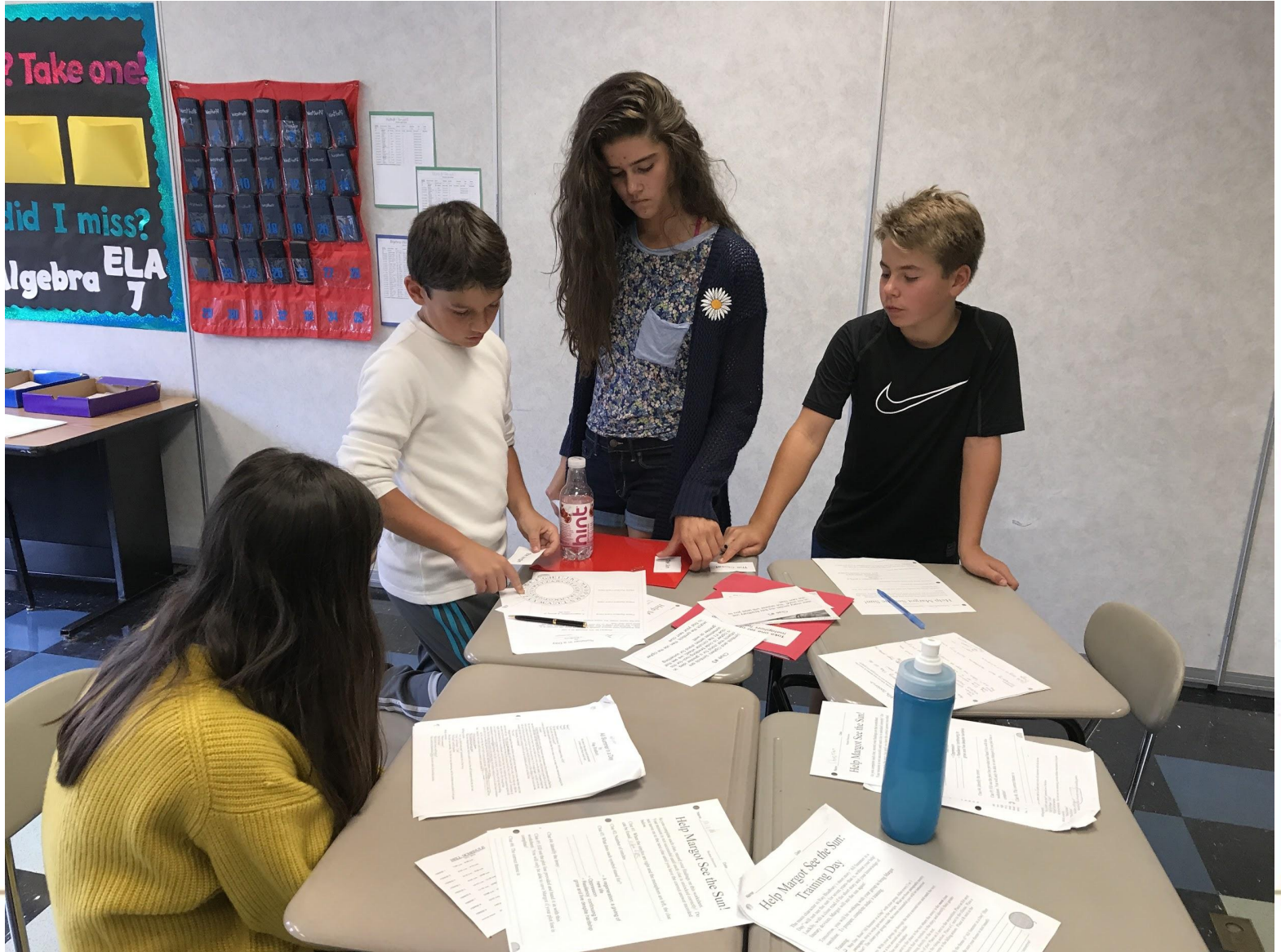

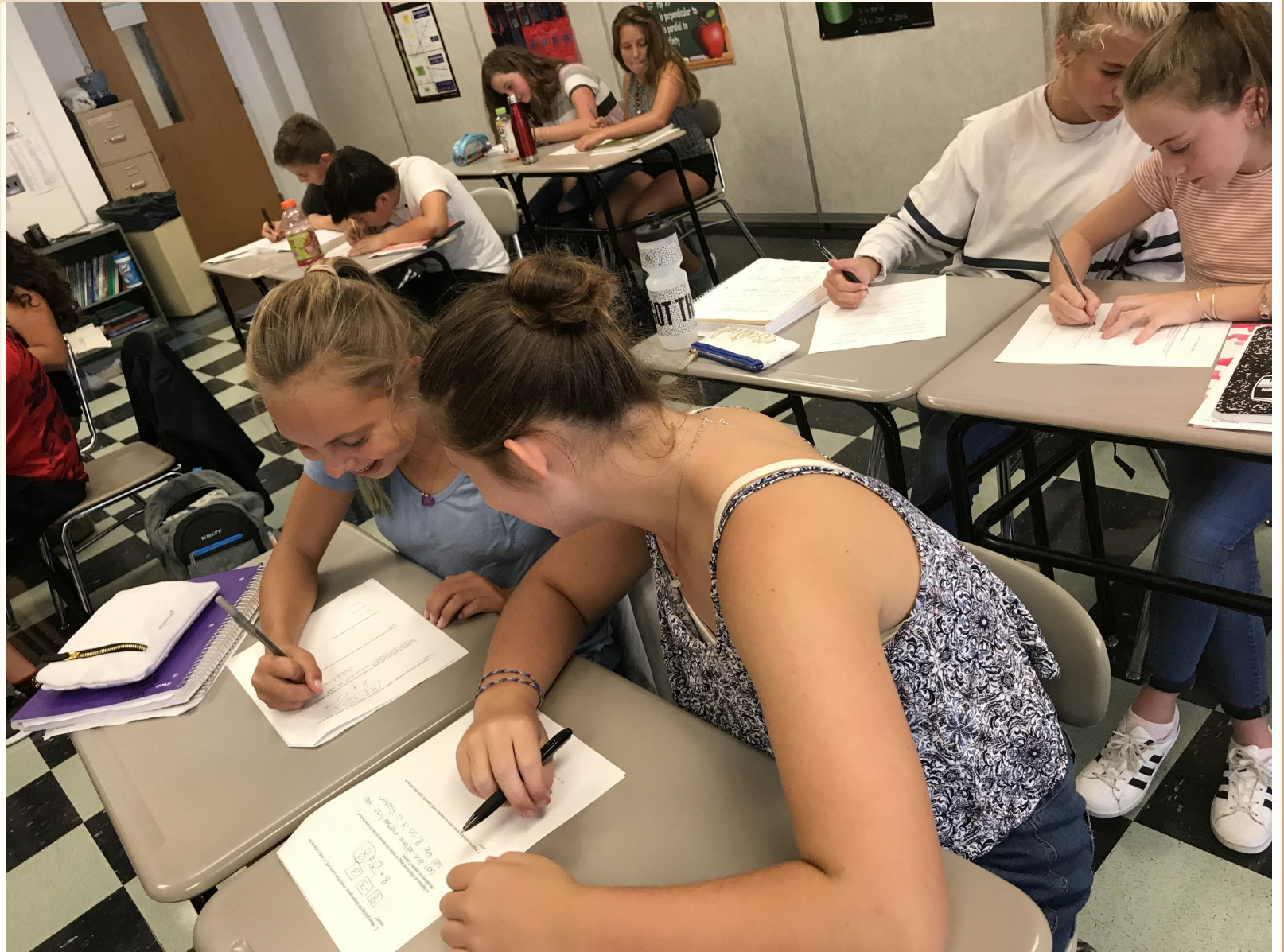

Facilities Report

Pierson Athletic Field:

- The Pierson athletic field work is substantially complete.
- The total cost of the project is \$633,600. This cost included the bid price of \$627,700 plus one change order in the amount of \$5,900 for additional sprinkler heads.









Pierson Athletic Field: continued

- The grass on the field grew to about 4” before the contractor mowed it for the first time down to 3”. The next mowing will bring it down to approximately 2.50” to 2.75”.
- The sod is knitting well and is on schedule. It is almost 4 weeks into an 8 week process. It will be reviewed on or about October 9 for Homecoming on October 12 and then for game use on October 14, but game use is a moving target based on sod growth.

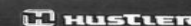

Business Report

Suffolk County-Wide Shared Services Plan:

- **The 2018 NYS Budget includes a new initiative designed to generate property tax savings by facilitating operational collaboration between local governments.**
- **Governor Andrew Cuomo's Shared Services Initiative (SSI) establishes a Shared Services Panel in each county, chaired by the Chief Executive Officer of the County.**
- **The SSI requires that each county in the State of New York present to the county's legislative body a draft plan by August 1st and approved by the Panel by September 15th.**
- **The Suffolk County draft plan is a launching point from which municipal leaders can begin to build a process that respects the independence and character of each participating municipal partner while allowing for an ongoing exchange of services, skills, equipment and information.**

Suffolk County-wide Shared Services Plan:

- County Leaders, in conjunction with Panel members developed **SuffolkShare** as the draft shared services plan for Suffolk County.
- This ten point plan is meant to provide a platform for using modern technology and best practices to transition from incidental cooperative projects to a contemporary comprehensive approach to how local governments can work with one another going forward.

Suffolk County-wide Shared Services Plan:

1. **Virtual Municipal Service Store.** A web portal that shall serve as a virtual store where a menu of municipal services and assets will be available to participating municipalities interested in acquiring services offered. To facilitate creation of the portal, Suffolk County Department of Information Technology (SCDOIT) applied for a New York State Local Government Efficiency grant. All of Suffolk County's 10 towns have provided letters of support endorsing SCDOIT's grant application.
2. **Inter-Municipal Services.** An assortment of services and assets will be offered to and from participating municipalities.
3. **Inter-Municipal Agreement.** An all-encompassing Inter-Municipal Agreement (IMA) authorizing municipal participation in this program and access to the web portal as well as templates for additional inter-municipal agreements for the use and procurement of various services and equipment.
4. **Certification Audit Process.** A certification function comprised of an auditing process that will identify and quantify savings achieved by the use of the shared services program.

Suffolk County-wide Shared Services Plan:

5. **Data Analysis**. A Data Analysis feature similar to a Customer Management System that will measure use, performance, and savings.
6. **MuniChat**. A virtual inter-municipal chat room for municipal representatives to engage one another individually or collectively to acquire information, share information, brainstorm, and highlight success stories.
7. **Shared Services Newsletter**. A virtual newsletter that will feature successful shared service ideas while providing insight into how to utilize the web portal, virtual municipal store, and all of the features of SuffolkShare.
8. **Intra-County Projects Program**.
 - a. **Procurement Consortium** - Purchasing cooperative would allow municipal partners to purchase larger quantities when combined thus creating more bargaining power when entering into annual agreements for purchases of goods, equipment and/or services.

Suffolk County-wide Shared Services Plan:

8. *Intra-County Projects Program.* Continued

b. **Youth Services** - Develop a comprehensive umbrella youth services program that builds upon the multiple inter-municipal agreements for youth programming and funding that presently exist today. Include and augment access to anti-gang and anti-drug programming, recreational opportunities, education and training services, transportation assistance, etc.

c. **Senior Services** - Develop a comprehensive umbrella senior citizen program that builds upon the multiple inter-municipal agreements for senior citizen programming and funding that presently exist today. Include and augment access to health care, social worker, support services, transportation to medical visits, visiting nurse services, food and nutrition programs, handyman assistance, physical fitness and social programming, etc.

Suffolk County-wide Shared Services Plan:

8. **Intra-County Projects Program.** Continued

d. **Recycling Services** - Expand municipal recycling efforts through the use of municipal recycling centers in towns that host such facilities. Partner with schools to create comprehensive school recycling program consistent with recycling obligations under state law.

e. **Water** - Increased partnership with water authority and districts to engage in waterway maintenance and nitrogen removal projects.

f. **Emergency Management** - Expand upon inter-municipal coordination relating to emergency management. Coordinate inter-municipal acquisition and maintenance of emergency equipment.

g. **Healthcare Consortium** - Explore cost-sharing relating to municipal health benefits.

h. **The Americans With Disabilities Act Compliance Program** - Municipalities working together to enhance compliance with the ADA.

9. **Inter-County Project Program.**
 - a. Health Department Services
 - b. County Jail and Adolescent Offender Services
 - c. Emergency Management
10. **Office of Inter-Municipal Coordination.** An assignment of personnel to handle inter-municipal activity and communications who will administer SuffolkShare while coordinating monthly subcommittee meetings

School Districts Under the NYS statute, public school districts are not required to participate in the county-wide shared services initiative but upon initiation of the plan's development in Suffolk County, all public school districts were invited to participate.

- Sag Harbor UFSD joined the Panel on July 19, 2017 and participated in the development of a draft plan to achieve property tax savings for Sag Harbor residents through the sharing of services with local municipal governments.

Shared Services Plan:

Currently:

- The **Sag Harbor Union Free School District** maintains an inter-municipal agreement with Wainscott Common School District to transport all their students during the ten-month school year and the summer.
- The district also maintains agreements with Sagaponack Common School District and Bridgehampton Union Free School District to transport their students to private, parochial, and summer schools.
- The district shares a bus mechanic and purchases bus fuel from the Southampton Union Free School District through another two agreements.
- The district is part of the BOCES cooperative bidding program, the Educational Data purchasing cooperative and "piggybacks" on Suffolk County contracts as much as possible.

Suffolk County shared services plan to save \$37 million

Suffolk supervisors, mayors, school leaders and County Executive Steve Bellone on Tuesday unanimously passed a plan to share municipal services that county officials hope will save county taxpayers \$37 million over the next two years.

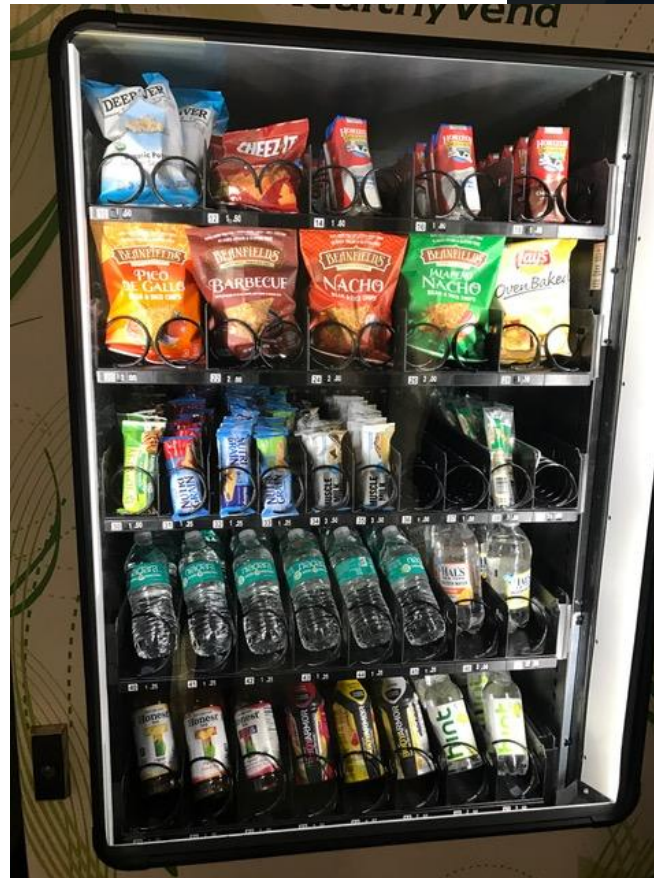
Towns, villages, some school districts and the county will create a “virtual store” where municipalities can rent equipment and services from each other, such as graffiti-removal trucks, pump-out boats, surveying and sign making.

Officials also say the bulk of the savings would come by combining purchasing power on items including uniforms, trucks and salt.

Government officials including the 10 town supervisors along with 19 village mayors, four school districts and the county executive voted 34 to 0 at the West Sayville Country Club, or participated by video conference.
