




Grade 3-8 ELA Assessment Level 3 & 4 Sag Harbor vs NYS 2017




Grade 3-8 ELA Assessment Mean Scale Score comparison 2016 vs 2017






Grade 3-8 Math Assessment Level 3 & 4 Sag Harbor vs NYS 2017




Grade 3-8 Math Assessment Mean Scale Score comparison 2016 vs 2017





More than 25,000 Long Island students took an SAT exam in 2016, according to the College Board.



More than 25,000 Long Island students took an SAT exam in 2016, according to the College Board. Students in the Jericho district scored the highest combined score, 1887, of the averages of the three components of the test – critical reading, math and writing. Here are the results for the 98 districts with students taking the exam.
