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

We are continually trying to improve our campus regarding safety concerns. Ben Whetstine, of the Siskiyou County Sheriff's Department, joined us last Thursday to work on scenario training. Staff



practiced different methods of stopping an intruder. Training also included going into a classroom to discuss lockdown procedures and additional needs of improvement to protect students in case of an intruder. Every training that our staff has attended, our instructors have stressed that our school is one of the safest in the county. Even with this thumbs up, we will continue to improve and practice new techniques and update security systems so that we are prepared to counter any intruder event. We are now working on improving communication between staff during an event, updating security cameras, and strengthening our school perimeter with new fencing.
