

The National Suicide Prevention Lifeline is a resource for individuals struggling or for those looking to help someone else. <u>The number to call is 1-800-273-8255</u>.


Those who need emotional crisis support can also text HELLO to 741741 to speak with a trained listener 24/7. It is free and confidential.

Teacher Evaluation Rubric

2022-2023 TEACHER EVALUATION RUBRIC

The teacher evaluation rubric for the 2022-2023 school year will be the National Institute for Excellence in Teaching (NIET) Teaching and Learning Standards rubric.

The 2021-2022 end-of-year cluster meetings will provide all teachers with an orientation to understanding the contents of the evaluation rubric. The beginning of year 2022-2023 cluster meetings will provide an opportunity for all teachers to review the rubric again. This time will also provide a deeper level of professional development around the domains, indicators and descriptors of effective teaching.



NIET TEACHING & LEARNING RUBIC TRAINING

The National Institute for Excellence in Teaching, based on nationally normed, research-based standards, has developed the NIET Teaching and Learning Standards Rubric. The rubric clearly defines effective teaching and fosters collaboration around a common language and vision that correlates with student achievement.

A comprehensive focus on four key domains will accompany the implementation of this observation system. The four key domains are; Instruction, Learning Environment, Designing and Planning Instruction, and Professionalism.

The NIET Teaching and Learning Standards Rubric will be used for teacher observations during the 2022-2023 school year in Natchitoches Parish Schools. Principals, Assistant Principals (who observe teachers), and Instructional Specialists will receive training regarding implementation and application of the NIET Rubric on June 6th, 7th, 8th, and 9th. Sessions start at 11:00 a.m. and conclude at 5:00 p.m. each day at the Natchitoches Events Center.



LEVEL TWO SCHOOL COLLABORATION & INSTRUCTIONAL LEADERSHIP TRAINING

Level Two Cluster and Instructional Leadership Team training will be delivered June 13th, 14th, 15th, and 16th. Sessions start at 11:00 a.m. and conclude at 5:00 p.m. each day.

Instructional Leadership Team members from each school are required to attend. Lead teachers are not required to attend. The location will be the Natchitoches Events Center. **ASSESSMENT & ACCOUNTABILITY**





CIS END OF YEAR CLOSEOUT FOR TEACHER EVALUATION

The teacher evaluation upload window opens on May 11, 2022. Please complete the following tasks in CIS no later than June 15, 2022. System requires two observations to complete the evaluation process.

Rate both SLT's for teachers and staff. Enter professional practice scores for teachers and staff. Once data is uploaded, finalize teacher evaluations.



View Act 108

ACT 108

In the Spring of 2021, the Louisiana Legislature enacted Act 108 which requires all kindergarten through third grade teachers who teach English, Math, Science, or Social Studies, to receive the Science of Reading Training. Administrators over these grades are required to receive this training as well.

Natchitoches Parish has organized schedules with each K-3 principal to hold these trainings in the 2022-2023 school year. A training schedule will be introduced to teachers soon. 2022 ASSESSMENT

High School End of Course testing has ended and the scores are coming in. The testing window for grades 3-8 will close on May 25th.

ELPT scores have yet to be released. LEAP Connect Scores have been sent to the schools. 504/SBLC Coordinators make sure to get all logs turned in along with any plans that may need signatures. Remember to bring 504 Plans for students who will be leaving your school to Mrs. Irchirl at the Media Center before leaving for the summer.

Testing Coordinators: Remember to turn in your testing binders, oaths, and rosters of students who did not show up for testing. Thank you to everyone that helped with testing. We could not have done it without all of your assistance and patience!
