Bid Requirements

The board recognizes the importance of:

- maximizing the use of district resources;
- the need for sound business practices in spending public money;
- the requirement of complying with state and federal laws governing purchasing and public works;
- the importance of standardized purchasing regulations; and
- the need for clear documentation.

I. Procurement and Public Works Using State Funds

A. Furniture, Supplies, or Equipment

Whenever the estimated cost of furniture, supplies or equipment (except books) will cost:

- less than \$40,000, no competitive bidding process is required to make the purchase;
- between \$40,000 and \$75,000, the board will follow the informal competitive bidding process by requiring quotes from at least three different sources to be obtained in writing or by telephone and recorded for the public to review;
- over \$75,000, the board will follow the formal competitive bidding process by:
 - 1. preparing clear and definite plans and specifications for such purchases;
 - providing notice of the call for formal bids by publication in at least one newspaper of general circulation in the district at least once each week for two consecutive weeks;
 - providing the clear and definite plans and specifications to those interested in submitting a bid;
 - 4. require that bids be in writing;
 - 5. open and read bids in public on the date and in the place named in the notice; and
 - 6. file all bids for public inspection after opening.

B. Exemptions

The board may waive bid requirements for purchases:

- clearly and legitimately limited to a single source of supply;
- involving special facilities or market conditions;
- in the event of an emergency;
- of insurance or bonds; and
- involving public works in the event of an emergency.

"Emergency" means unforeseen circumstances beyond the district's control that present a real, immediate threat to the proper performance of essential functions or will likely result in material loss or damage to property, bodily injury or loss of life if immediate action is not taken.

Whenever bid requirements are waived, a document explaining the factual basis for the exception and the contract will be recorded and open for public inspection.

C. Rejection of Bids

The board may by resolution reject any and all bids and make further calls for bids in the same manner as the original call.

D. Interlocal Cooperation Act

The board reserves the right to enter into inter-local cooperative agreements for purchases and public works with other governmental agencies pursuant to the Interlocal Cooperation Act, Chapter 39.34 RCW.

E. Crimes Against Children

The board will include in any contract for services with an entity or individual other than an employee of the district a provision requiring the contractor to prohibit any employee of the contractor from working at a public school who has contact with children at a public school during the course of his or her employment and who has pled guilty to or been convicted of any felony crime specified under RCW 28A.400.322. The contract shall also contain a provision that any failure to comply with this section shall be grounds for the district immediately terminating the contract.

The superintendent will establish bidding and contract awarding procedures for all purchases of furniture, equipment, supplies (except books) or public works projects consistent with state law.

F. Use of State Funds for Improvements or Repairs

The board may make improvements or repairs to district property through a district department without following the competitive bidding process if the total cost of improvements or repairs does not exceed \$100,000. If the board estimates that the total cost of a building, improvement, repair, or other public works project is \$100,000 or more, the board will follow the formal competitive bidding process outlined above unless the contract is let using the small works roster process authorized by RCW 39.04.155 or under any other procedure authorized for school districts.

II. Procurement Using Federal Funds

A. Goods

When federal funds are used for procurement of goods (furniture, supplies, equipment, and textbooks):

- Purchases of \$3,500 or less do not require quotes. However, the district must consider price to be reasonable, and, to the extent practical, distribute purchases equitably among suppliers.
- Purchases between \$3,500 and \$75,000 must be procured using price or rate quotations from three or more qualified sources.
- Purchases of \$75,000 or more must be publicly solicited using sealed bids.

B. Services

When federal funds are used for procurement of services:

- Purchases of \$10,0003,500 or less do not require quotes. However, the district must consider price
 to be reasonable, and, to the extent practical, distribute purchases equitably among suppliers.
- Purchases between \$10,0003,500 and \$250150,000 must be procured using price or rate quotations from a reasonable number of qualified sources.
- Purchases of \$2±50,000 or more must be publicly solicited using sealed bids.

C. Noncompetitive Proposals

Procurement by **noncompetitive** proposals may only be used when one of the following four circumstances applies:

- The item is only available from a single source;
- The public exigency or emergency for the requirement will not permit a delay resulting from competitive solicitation;
- The awarding agency (e.g., OSPI) authorizes a noncompetitive proposal in response to a written request from the district; or
- After solicitation of a number of sources, competition is determined inadequate.

The district must maintain documentation supporting the applicable circumstance for noncompetitive proposals.

D. Suspension and Debarment

Before entering into federally funded vendor contracts for goods and services that equal or exceed \$25,000 and any subcontract award, the district will ensure the vendor is not suspended or debarred from participating in federal assistance programs.

E. Conflict of Interest

No employee, officer or agent may participate in the selection, award or administration of a contract supported by federal funds if he or she has a real or apparent conflict of interest. Such a conflict would arise when the employee, officer or agent, any member of his or her immediate family, his or her partner, or an organization which employs or is about to employ any of the parties indicated herein has a financial or other interest in or a tangible personal benefit from a firm considered for a contract.

No employee, officer or agent of the district may solicit or accept gratuities, favors or anything of monetary value from contractors or parties to subcontracts. Violation of these standards may result in disciplinary action including, but not limited to, suspension, dismissal or removal.

III. Local Option Preference

Where allowed under state and federal law the district will give preference to vendors and contractors who reside within the closest proximity to the City of Ridgefield.

IV. Procedures

The superintendent or designee will establish bidding and contract awarding procedures consistent with state and federal law.

Our identification process includes a universal screener that we use to identify students that we invite to participate in the identification process. All testing is done during the school day.

Our Highly Capable Implementation Team will participate in OSPI HighCapPLUS training module on identification process. This team is going to lead an identification process with staff during staff meetings that will provide information to teachers on how to identify highly capable students from low-income or under-represented groups.

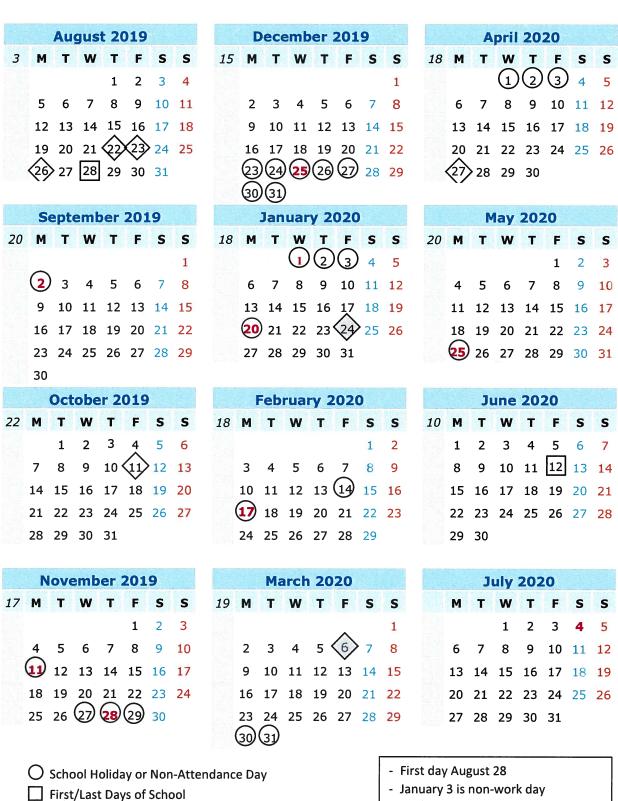

Section: 3000 - Students

Classroom Management, Discipline, and Corrective Action

Rules of student conduct are essential to maintainfor maintaining a schoolsafe and supporting learning environment conductive to learningfor all students. A student's refusal to comply with written rules and regulations established for the governing of the school will constitute sufficient cause for discipline or corrective disciplinary action.

Staff are responsible for supervising student behavior, employing effective classroom management methods, and enforcing the rules of student conduct in a fair, consistent, and non-discriminatory manner.

Corrective Disciplinary action must be reasonable, culturally responsive, and necessary under the circumstances and reflect, while reflecting the district's priority to maintain a safe and positive learning environment for all students and staff. The district will administer disciplinary action in a way that responds to the needs and strengths of students, supports students in meeting behavioral expectations, and keeps them within the classroom to the maximum extent possible.

When administering discipline under this policy and the related procedure, district staff must not:

- Unlawfully discriminate against a student on the basis of sex, race, creed, religion, color, national
 origin, age, veteran or military status, sexual orientation, gender expression or identity, disability,
 or the use of a trained dog guide or service animal;
- Deprive a student of constitutional rights to freedom of speech, press, peaceable assembly, petition the government and its representatives for a redress of grievances, free exercise of religion, free from sectarian control or influence, subject to reasonable time, place, and manner limitations on exercising such rights;
- Deprive a student of the constitutional right to be secure in the person, papers, and effects against unreasonable searches and seizures;
- Unlawfully interfere in a student's pursuit of an education while in the custody of the school district;
 or
- Deprive a student of the right to an equal educational opportunity, in whole or in part, without due process of law.

The district will distribute its discipline policy and procedure to students, their parents/guardians,-_and the community on an annual basis. StudentsThe district will provide students and/or their parents/guardians will be providedwith all required substantive and procedural due process in regard to concerning grievances, hearings, and/or appeals of corrective action. The district will ensure that it provides such information with language assistance for students and parents with limited-English proficiency under Title VI of the Civil Rights Act of 1964. The district will also strive to provide trainings regarding policies and procedures related to student discipline for appropriate school and district staff whose duties require them to interact with students and enforce or implement components of student discipline. ——____

The district will assist long-term suspended and expelled students in returning to school as soon as possible by providing them with a reengagement plan tailored to the student's individual circumstances, including consideration of the incident that led to the student's long-term suspension or expulsion.

The District, however, may preclude a student from returning to the student's regular educational setting following the end date of a suspension or expulsion for the purpose of protecting victims of certain offenses, as follows:

- A student committing an offense under RCW 28A.600.460 (2), when the activity is directed toward the teacher, shall not be assigned to that teacher's classroom for the duration of the student's attendance at that school or any other school where the teacher is assigned; and
- A student who commits an offense under RCW 28A.600.460 (3), when directed toward another student, may be removed from the classroom of the victim for the duration of the student's attendance at that school or any other school where the victim is enrolled.

The district will annually collect and review data on disciplinary actions taken against students within each school. –The data will be disaggregated into subgroups as required by RCW 28A.300.042 and will, include students protected by the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act and Section 504 of the Rehabilitation Act of 1973. –The review must include short-term suspensions, long-term suspensions, and expulsions.– In reviewing the data, the district will determine whether it has disciplined a substantially disproportionate number of students within any of the disaggregated categories. –If the district finds disproportionality—is found, the district will take action to ensure that it is not the result of discrimination.—

In consultation with school district staff, students, families, and the community, the district will periodically review and update this policy and its accompanying procedure.
