### BOARD OFFICER ELECTION PROCEDURE

Voting for School Board officers shall normally be done by secret ballot. The officers shall be elected in the following order: President, Vice-President, Treasurer, and Clerk.

The current Board President shall have the duty of presiding over the election of officers, unless he/she is no longer on the Board, in which case the Board shall appoint a temporary chair by majority vote for purposes of presiding over the election of officers. The Board President or other presiding officer shall appoint a member of the District staff to count any paper ballots used in connection with the election process and shall then confirm with the School Board the method of voting that will be used to elect officers. The election process, to be repeated as many times for each office as necessary to elect the officer, shall be as follows:

- 1. The current Board President or other presiding officer shall make a call for nominations for the officer position to be elected. Any Board member may nominate any eligible person for the office, including him/herself. Multiple nominations can be made and voted on by secret ballot.
  - Nominations need not be seconded. Additional nominees (including nominees who previously declined nomination or who withdrew from consideration during a prior round of voting) may be added prior to each new round of voting for the office, if such additional rounds of voting are needed.
- 2. The nominees (or any new nominee(s) added in a subsequent round of voting) shall be asked to accept or decline the nomination. If a nominee accepts the nomination, his/her name shall be included in the vote(s) for the officer position in question until such time as he/she may withdraw his/her name from consideration. If a nominee declines the nomination, his/her name is not included in the vote(s) for the position.
- 3. Once the nominees for the particular round of voting are clearly established, a vote shall be taken by the method specified above, or by such other method as is selected by a majority vote of the Board at the outset of the organizational meeting. All Board members who are participating in the meeting, including all nominees for the officer position in question, shall cast a vote. In the event that there is only one nominee for an office, the Board may set aside any prior decision to use secret ballots by a showing of unanimous consent, and then conduct a voice vote or other type of vote to elect the officer.
- 4. If a nominee earns a majority of the votes cast for the officer position in question, that nominee shall be asked whether he/she accepts the position. If the victorious nominee accepts the position, the position is filled and the process begins anew for the next officer position until all officer positions are filled. If the victorious nominee declines the position or if no nominee earns a majority of the votes cast, the voting process repeats for that position.

- 1. Discussion about our lawn service care, and bids for the 2023 service. Service bids were requested from our current provider Tru Green, as well as from a different provider River Valley Lawn Care. We have had difficulty with the level of service provided by Tru Green, late or nonexistent service. River Valley comes highly recommended by some other school districts in the coulee region and we would like to give them a try. This is a granular slow release product vs. Tru Greens liquid spray on product. Decision was made to work with River Valley this year.
- 2. Miller Electric and Kish Electric submitted bids to complete some electrical work for the kitchen. There are two panels in the kitchen itself that need to be removed and replaced. In addition there are feed conductors and breakers in an original (1965) switchboard that need to be rerouted to blanks available on a 1998 panel. Miller Electric quoted something slightly different which is a partial fix to the problem with the panel. DJ is still awaiting a bid from MD Electric; the fix that Kish is recommending seems to be in the best interest of the school district at this time. This will come to the full board at the May meeting, securing materials might push this project into the fall or even next summer depending on the length of time needed for completion, and the lack of available electric service to the building during the repairs/replacement.
- 3. We compared bids on Sico lunch tables, these are very high quality tables that have lasted 40 years before replacement at the MS/HS level. The bids were from Marshfield and from Scholastic on the same tables.
  - Marshfield- 2733.56 per table
  - Scholastic-2571.75 per table

We need 10 tables to replace tables with hydraulic closures that no longer work. These tables have also had the hardware replaced on them one time already.

Recommendation to purchase tables through fund 50 from Scholastic at \$25,717.50

DJ will check shared purchasing to see if there is a cheaper rate prior to the board meeting in May.

- 4. Some aluminum football benches are requested for the football field, these can also be used during track season. Each 21 foot bench is 1,050. Committee agreed to purchase with Griffin funds.
- 5. A bid from Greeley to replace the signage outside of classrooms around the building to match the new locker room and pool area came in at \$21, 239.36, for 176 signs and installation. Mr. Olsen and DJ McNamer will be looking into more cost effective options.
- 6. Discussion of the bus barn, and how much sq. footage is included in the current buildings.

Now a biological reserve - and still primarily an English-speaking community - this treasure land of natural phenomena stretches from the lush ferns and mosses that cover the ground to the dark canopy formed by the tallest trees.

Ziplining adventure

Make like the birds and the monkeys who call the cloud forest home. Special trails and zip lines unveil one of the planet's most fascinating ecological systems from a unique perspective-the tops of the trees. 




