



SUPERINTENDENT'S MESSAGE

It's hard to believe, but we're nearly at the end of the first quarter already! Our staff and students have had a great start to the 2022-23 school year. They picked up right where they left off in May with real-world application of their learning and building their

leadership skills through clubs, athletics and performing arts.



The hard work of our staff and students over the last year is reflected in our student achievement and growth scores, which were recently released. Achievement scores measure students' performance against a set scale, and growth scores measure the amount of improvement compared to other students in the state. I'm happy to report that both scores significantly improved over previous results.

I want to specifically thank and congratulate our Calhan Middle School (CMS) team. Their work has resulted in CMS being Accredited with Distinction. This accreditation is reserved for the highest performing schools in the state and is the result of a concerted effort on the part of students and staff. All of this good news is received against a backdrop of national reports of declining math and reading scores, so well done CMS!

Even as we celebrate this good news, we must remember there is work to be done. We must continue to provide education and training that is responsive to the current economy, and that means expanding our capabilities and program offerings. We are working on several initiatives this year that are outlined in our Strategic Plan to help us achieve this.

First, Calhan School District will be on the Nov. 8 ballot with a bond issue designed to help us construct a permanent facility for our Career and Technical Education (CTE) programs. Our CTE is a crucial part of Calhan's future and helps students enter high-paying jobs as

soon as they graduate. Learn more about this bond issue on page 4 of this newsletter.

Second, we are excited to add Criminal Justice, Teacher Cadet and Paraprofessional pathways to our CTE this year. The Criminal Justice program covers everything from constitutional law to enforcement. The Teacher Cadet program prepares high school students who wish to pursue a teaching career while the Paraprofessional program prepares students to become paraprofessionals, or teacher assistants, after graduation.

Similarly, Calhan was instrumental in the new Calhan Teacher Apprenticeship Program, which was approved by the U.S. Department of Labor and is now being offered in our schools. It is an alternative for those wishing to become a teacher who don't have the ability to earn a typical four-year degree. Now, people with two or three years of experience working with children can receive a teaching credential through an apprenticeship. The program is one solution to the nationwide teacher shortage.

Third, we will continue building on our improved test scores by focusing on three pillars of success this year: on-time attendance, on-time work and discipline. Our data shows students who struggle are those who are not in school regularly and don't turn in their work, making it hard for us to identify the help and support they need.

CMS EARNS ACCREDITATION WITH DISTINCTION

Calhan Middle School has earned the performance rating of Accredited with Distinction as measured by the Colorado Measures of Academic Success (CMAS) for the 2021-22 school year. The philosophical views on standardized testing vary widely, but we at Calhan have determined that these tests measure far more than the academic prowess of a student or students. The skills required to score at the highest level, Accredited with Distinction, go far beyond a student's academic ability. These skills include choosing to succeed, not making excuses, doing hard things, and bringing their best every day. We believe that acquiring these skills leads to post-secondary success and they are visible in our Calhan Graduation Competencies.

The display of these skills, along with grit and perseverance from students and faculty, has been instrumental in Calhan Middle School achieving this high academic performance status.

Over the past four years, we have strategically implemented "standards first" education in mathematics, "text first" instruction in language arts, and The 7 Mindsets, a social-emotional curriculum designed to enhance our positive school culture. CALHAN SLATED FOR NOV. 8 BALLOT

Calhan School District is on the Nov. 8 ballot with a \$7.5 million (10.1 mills) bond issue. If passed, the monthly cost to residential taxpayers will be \$5.88 per \$100,000 of a home's market value, as recorded on the County Auditor's website. The funding would be used exclusively to build a permanent facility for the Career Technical Education program. The new building would include:

- A two-bay shop for metal and woodworking
- Five classrooms, one of which will be outfitted with stove and oven stations
- Space to grow plants
- Equipment for agriculture, agriculture mechanics, family consumer science/home economics and aviation programs
- Apparatus for future programs such as stoves/ovens, sewing machines and metal and woodworking equipment

The proposed facility would replace the trailers and sheds currently in use, enhancing the level of safety for staff and students. Additionally, it would better equip students to enter the workforce immediately upon graduation.

Calhan Schools' goal is to offer students unlimited opportunities to choose to succeed and ensure that students understand the value of learning by offering education that matters. This bond issue is an important step for our future so that we can continue to meet this mission.
