## **TOPS AWARDS & SCHOLARSHIP REQUIREMENTS**

#### **TOPS OPPORTUNITY:**

Tuition Exempt 20 ACT & 2.5 GPA

#### **TOPS PERFORMANCE:**

Tuition Exempt AND \$200 per semester 23 ACT & 3.25 GPA

#### **TOPS HONORS:**

Tuition Exempt AND \$400 per semester 27 ACT & 3.5 GPA

#### **TOPS TECH:**

2 Year Tuition Exempt from a Community college or Tech School 17 ACT (or Silver in WorkKeys) & 2.5 GPA

## FAFSA

FAFSA stands for Free Application for Federal Student Aid. It is the form/application that is completed by current and prospective college students in the United States to determine their eligibility for student financial aid. It is also the application used for the Louisiana TOPS Program and federal financial aid such as grants, loans, and work study programs. FAFSA completion is required by most colleges. No financial aid and/or scholarships will be offered to a student until they have applied for admission and their ACT scores have been sent to the college(s) of his/her choice. Each school has a limited amount of certain types of financial aid money to be awarded. Students who apply for admission and send in the FAFSA form early have the best chance of receiving financial aid money if they meet the qualifications. Please complete the FAFSA application as soon as possible. Completing your FAFSA application OR signing a waiver that you do not wish to participate is a REQUIREMENT to graduate. Opens **October 1, 2022**.

ADMISSION APPLICATIONS: STEP #1 – Register for a FSA ID at https://fsaid.ed.gov/. Registration consists of 3 steps:

**Enter Login Information** 

• Let us know what log-in information you would like to use. Provide us with a unique username, password and Are you 13 year of age or older?

**Enter Personal Information** 

- Enter Social Security number, name, and date of birth.
- (Optional) Include your mailing address, e-mail address and language preference.
- Provide five challenge questions and answers. This adds an extra level of security to your FSA ID. If you forget your username or password, you can retrieve your username or reset your password by providing answers to your challenge questions.

**Submit Your FSA ID Application** 

- Agree not to share your FSA ID with anyone. The security of your FSA ID is important because it can be used to electronically sign Federal Student Aid documents, access your personal records, and make binding legal obligations.
- (Optional) Verify your e-mail. By verifying your e-mail, you can use your e-mail as your username when logging into FSA applications.

Once we complete verification with the SSA (1-3 days), you will be able to use your FSA ID to access your personal information on Federal Student Aid websites.

STEP #2 - Complete the FAFSA worksheet. You will need the following information:

- Social security number (student and parents)
- Driver's license number (student)
- Income tax returns including IRS W-2 information (student and parents)
- Records of untaxed income, such as child support received, interest income, and veterans noneducation benefits (student and parents)
- Current bank statements, current business and investment mortgage information, business and farm records, stock, bond and other investment records (student and parents)

STEP #3 – Complete the FAFSA online at www.fasfa.gov. You should have your FAFSA worksheet completed to use as a guide. The FSA ID for the student and parent are used to sign electronically. Print a copy of the confirmation page to keep for your records as documentation.

STEP #4 – A Student Aid Report (SAR) will be sent to you by mail or e-mail. Review your SAR and, if necessary, make changes or corrections and submit your SAR for reprocessing. If you submit the SAR online, you can sign it electronically with your PIN number. If you submit a paper SAR, you must sign the paper form and mail it back to the processors. Your complete, correct SAR will contain your Expected Family Contribution (EFC) number. This number is used to determine your eligibility for federal aid.

STEP #5 – The school or schools that you identify on the FAFSA will receive your information. They may request additional information from you to verify the information that you entered on the FAFSA. Be sure to respond as quickly as possible so that you do not miss any deadlines.

STEP #6 – The school or schools that have received your information will send out award letters. Review the award letters carefully to compare the amounts and types of aid offered. Respond to the offers before the deadlines. Accept the awards that you want and decline the awards that you do not want or need.

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**ADMISSION APPLICATIONS:** Current college applications and information are available online for colleges and universities. IT IS VERY IMPORTANT THAT YOU COMPLETE COLLEGE ADMISSION APPLICATIONS AS EARLY AS POSSIBLE. DO NOT WAIT UNTIL THE END OF YOUR SENIOR YEAR TO BEGIN THE ADMISSIONS PROCESS.

**TECHNICAL PROGRAM ADMISSION:** Those students planning to attend technical college after graduation should call the school they are interested in attending and make an appointment with the admissions counselor. It is recommended that you call in the early spring as many programs have limited space and require an entry test. Scholarships and financial aid cannot be offered until you have applied for admission.

**MILITARY:** Students interested in joining a branch of the military should speak to several different recruiters to discover which branch of the military will best meet their needs and achieve their goals.

**SELECTIVE SERVICE REGISTRATION:** Federal law requires that all young men register with Selective Service within 30 days of their 18th birthday. By registering, not only are they in compliance with the law but remain eligible for benefits associated with registration, such as, college student loans and grants, job training, and Federal and some state government jobs. You may register on the Internet at www.sss.gov.

**COLLEGE ATHLETICS:** Students planning to participate in athletics at the college level should first talk to their coach and then register with the NCAA Clearinghouse at http://ncaa.org/ for more information and https://web3.ncaa.org/ECWR2/NCAA\_EMS/NCAA.jsp to register. Please see the counselor for more information.

**COLLEGE ADMISSION**: The following is suggested for seniors planning to attend college after graduation.

**OCTOBER**: All schools have application forms and information online. If you have not decided between one or more schools, you need to apply to the ones that you are interested in. Check to see what is required to apply for admission and begin working on your applications. Most charge an application fee and require that applicants submit updated immunization information. Each college has different deadlines for admission, scholarships, and financial aid. It is VERY IMPORTANT that you check online to get the information you need and that you submit everything that is required on time.

Information on the financial aid process and completing the FAFSA form is attached to the October newsletter. The FAFSA form is the application for the Louisiana TOPS Program and federal financial aid (grants, loans, and work study programs). Complete the FAFSA form as soon as possible. You may begin on **October 1, 2022**.

**NOVEMBER** – Complete college applications. Most colleges now have their applications online. Applications should be checked carefully before being submitted. Most schools now have access to your transcript online. If you are asked to send in a transcript with your application, you may get a copy of your transcript from the counselor's office. Once the college has processed your application, you will get a letter from the college rejecting your application or accepting you provisionally. Your acceptance will not become final until the college receives an official copy of your transcript after graduation showing that you have received a high school diploma. Your official transcript is not available until after you have graduated. Check scholarship deadlines. College scholarship applications may be found on-line.

**SCHOLARSHIP INFORMATION**: Please check college websites for detailed information on scholarship requirements, applications, and deadlines. Each college has specific deadlines for admission and scholarships. Check websites early to meet all deadlines. You should apply by the priority deadline if you meet the criteria. Many schools have a limited amount of money available.
