WORLD'S BEST WORKFORCE HISTORY AND GOALS


In 2013 the Minnesota Legislature approved put into law the World's Best Workforce Plan. MN Statute 120.B11 requiring all school district to develop a plan to address five goals:

- ✓ All racial and economic achievement gaps between students are closed
- ✓ All students are ready for career and college
- ✓ All students graduate from High School.




ACTIONS AND PROGRESS


3rd Grade Reading Proficiency




ACT Composite Scores

- The Hills-Beaver Creek School district was formed in 1965 by the consolidation of the Hills and Beaver Creek School Districts
- Hills-Beaver Creek's student enrollment was 368 students in 2018
- The district has two schools: Hills-Beaver Creek Elementary and Hills-Beaver Creek Secondary
- The district covers 117 square miles.
- Students served reside in the following communities: Hills, Beaver Creek, Steen, Luverne, Valley Springs, and Jasper.
- o 67% of teachers have their Bachelor's Degree
- 32% of Teachers have their Master's Degree (or greater)
- Students served from other districts = 60
- Students choosing to leave H-BC School District = 45
- H-BC serves 15 additional students
