Wednesday, December 19th is the last Bulldog Day of 2018!


Bulldog Day is a new program developed by the staff to encourage responsibility in paper management, grade management, and to increase communication between parents and students regarding the work being done at school.

As a result, children who must enter foster care not only lose their families, but also friends, teachers, tutors, counselors, administrators, bus drivers, food service workers and custodians.
