# **CMMS Shoe Drive**

Christa McAuliffe Middle School has just wrapped up a 3 month shoe drive fundraiser. Starting back at school registration in August, CMMS started collecting gently worn, or new, shoes. These were to be shoes that you would borrow to your best friend. This was all done to help benefit both CMMS and residents in underdeveloped or impoverished countries. The shoes will be cleaned up and shipped to these countries where residents will be taught how to create their own business in reselling these shoes. "Teach a man to fish...." is the goal behind this endeavor.

The CMMS students, with the help of Hopevale Church and New Life Missionary Church, collected over 1,900 pairs of sneakers, sandals, dress shoes, boots and cleats. The churches allowed CMMS to put collection boxes at their services. We appreciate the help of our neighbors.



The CMMS Lighthouse team was helpful in counting and banding the shoes together. Each pair of shoes had to be tied or banded and then 25 pairs had to be put in each bag. The goal was 100 bags, or 2,500 pairs of shoes. CMMS collected 79 bags, or 1,950 pairs. For their efforts, CMMS will be receiving approximately \$600 from the funds2org group and Hopevale Church has generously donated \$300 toward the goal of \$1,000

A great effort was put forth by all the students and staff, including a classroom challenge that had Ms. Gradowski's class, Mrs. Windiate's class and Mrs. Goodnight's class winning pizza parties for collecting the most shoes. Way to go, Bobcats!

#### **Food Drive**



#### **New This Year**


