A. Fact-finding Hearing Conducted by Administrative Review in Case Number 18-19/02

Motion by Board Member Wallace and seconded by Board Member Snodderly :

It is moved that the Board of Education find there is cause to expel Student No. 171219 from all schools in the District for violation of Education Code

- 48915 (3) Unlawfully selling a controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code.

- 48900(c) Unlawfully possessed, used, sold, or otherwise furnished, or been under the influence of, a controlled substance listed in Chapter 2 (commencing with Section 11053) of Division 10 of the Health and Safety Code, an alcoholic beverage, or an intoxicant of any kind.

Panel Recommendation

1. Student No. 171219 shall be expelled from the schools of the District for the remainder of the fall and spring semester 2018-2019 school year. It is further recommended that

student 171219 may enroll at Orestimba High School at the beginning of the 2019-2020 school year.


