

The levels of support offered will be reviewed and modified every five weeks based on progress report & report card grades, as well as other academic performance indicators. Message from the Elementary School Principal...

Hello Candor Community!

It is hard to believe that we are just about ten weeks into the school year already! We have accomplished so much academically and socially within each classroom. I am extremely proud of our staff, who are dedicated to the success of our students. December 4th marks the end of the first trimester, with report cards going home on December 7th. We will also be hosting Parent/Teacher Conferences on December 8th and 9th. These days will be half days for students.

Our teachers are continuously reflecting on their practice to ensure we are making informed decisions regarding the curriculum. This month several teachers and I reflected on the students' Spring 2022 state assessment data. After analyzing the data, teachers walked away with several "next steps" to initiate within the classroom to support student growth. Among those "next steps" was to have our math committee develop, focus on & share math strategies that align vertically throughout our building. Additionally, we are committed to providing opportunities for our students to develop problem-solving skills, strengthen their stamina and encourage productive struggle in meaningful, supportive ways.

Lastly, one of the most important things your child can do to reach the goal of success is also one of the most basic: **attend school every day on time!** School attendance is a powerful predictor of student outcomes. If children don't show up for school regularly, they miss out on fundamental skills and the chance to build routines and healthy habits that will carry them into college and careers. Research has shown that your child's regular attendance may be the greatest factor influencing his/her academic success. Please take a close look at the two tables below for additional information regarding the impact that just a few days absent has on your child.

Before You Yell at the Referees Tonight, Let Me Tell You About My Daddy

● Most of the time, you probably don't even notice he's there. But the official prowling the sidelines of your high school gymnasium isn't just a zebra to shout angry words at from your spot in the stands - he's my daddy.

And I'm counting on you to be kind.

- For a few months every year, he's gone most evenings blowing his whistle in gyms from down the street to halfway across the state. When he leaves for work in the mornings, he takes along a black suitcase with his striped shirt, Sansabelt pants, and a pocketful of rule books and Fox 40s - ready to head straight to another game once his 9-to-5 is done.
- On many of those evenings, we follow him. My mom packs a bag with toys and snacks and cash for concessions; our "basketball bag" lives in the front hall, ready and waiting for Daddy's next game.
- We drive country highways to the "Home of the Braves/Lakers/Lions etc." and settle into an inconspicuous corner of the bleachers to watch him work. More often than not, we don't know anyone in the crowd, and when one of us kids asks which team we're going for tonight, Mom always tells us, "We're cheering for the refs."
- Because if there's anything I've already learned from being in the crowd at youth sporting events, it's that most people do exactly the opposite.
- What so many fans forget is that the crew of officials that's so easy to criticize is actually just a trio of average people.
 - ◇ They're teachers and pharmacists and mothers and bankers and car salesmen.
 - ◇ They're the people you bump into at the grocery store and sit behind in the pews on Sunday mornings at church.
 - ◇ They're your neighbors, your old classmates, the parents of your kids' friends.
 - ◇ They also choose to work a mostly thankless side job as sports officials.

I promise you, they're working harder than you realize to make the experience of playing and watching youth sports safe, fair, and fun.

I see how hard my daddy's working out there—and I wish you did, too.

- While everyone else is watching the ball swish through the hoop, my eyes are trained on the one standing on the sidelines with two arms in the air, signaling three points.
- When fans are erupting over another fast break, I'm watching him match their speed step for thundering step.
- When teams are huddled together hurriedly plotting last-possession strategy, I see him talking with the scorekeeper, game ball on his hip, calmly making sure he and his partners are prepared for whatever scenario plays out next.
- And what you probably don't realize is that when my daddy's on the court, he's doing a lot more than calling travels, administering free throws, and ignoring "over the backs" (fact check: not a thing).
- He's showing me what it means to work hard and better myself.
- He's teaching me about camaraderie and friendship.
- He's showing me the importance and joy of pursuing a hobby.
- He's modeling for me the value of patience and persistence.
- He knows angry words, argumentative coaches, and constant criticism is all just part of the gig. (I think he even enjoys it sometimes.)

But what you should remember when you're ready to berate him from the stands next time is this: he deserves your respect.

- The fact is, he's spending a lot of time away from our house to pursue something that's become a passion. He's logging countless hours running up and down gym floors, then icing his aching knee afterward.
- He's watching tape of the game long after we've gone to bed, critiquing everything from the strength of his whistle to how much his left arm swings when he runs.
- He takes pride in the work most people aren't brave enough to do.

And you know what I know for sure? He does that work so well. That's my hero out there on the court, wearing the stripes. And I'm counting on you to be kind.







Students are encouraged to register online at www.collegeboard.org. College Board also offers helpful study tips, practice tests and more! They will even send you a daily practice question. Students may also register in Student Services. The SAT can be taken as many times as it is offered. Check the website of the college you are interested in to see their minimum score requirement.



PSAT (Preliminary Scholastic Aptitude Test)

On October 12th the majority of the junior class had the opportunity to take the PSAT. Results can soon be reviewed on the College Board website at www.collegeboard.org. Mr. Banks will be reviewing the score report in class and helping students understand their scores. They will have the opportunity to log on to the College Board website and create an account, if they haven't already done so. They will review their score and have the opportunity to receive free study guides from the College Board specifically tailored to their needs.



ASVAB (Armed Services Vocational Aptitude Battery)

The ASVAB career exploration program is a comprehensive career planning program that includes a multiple-aptitude test battery, an interest inventory and various career planning tools designed to help students explore career opportunities. This exam may also be used as an Armed Forces entrance exam. If there are students interested in taking the exam please see Mr. Banks.



FAFSA

The Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) is available online at www.fafsa.ed.gov. Students can start to complete the FAFSA on October 1st, 2022 (for the 2023-2024 school year).

The Selection Process for future members will begin in December, and will be completed by the end of February, 2023. It will culminate with the Induction Ceremony March 9, 2023, at 6:30pm in the high school auditorium. The scholastically eligible students will receive a letter and application from Ms. Westervelt prior to the holiday break. Students in grades 10 – 12 are eligible to apply if their overall GPA is at least an 87%. If the student chooses, they can submit their application to be further evaluated on the three additional criteria of leadership, character, and service. The selection process uses a uniform point system, guided by a very specific rubric. The use of an objective and fair system for selection is our highest priority. All students who are eligible and apply, will be notified of their selection to be a member of the club, through receiving a letter via the USPS mail, at least a week prior to the induction ceremony.

STAR INFORMATION

The New York State School Tax Relief Program (STAR) provides homeowners with two types of partial exemptions from school property taxes. ***For further STAR information, contact your local assessor’s office, call toll free at 1-888-697-8275, or visit the New York State website at: <http://www.tax.ny.gov/pit/property/star/eligibility.htm>.***

Requirements for Basic and Enhanced STAR:

Factor	Basic STAR	Enhanced STAR
Residency	<p>The property must be the primary residence of an owner.</p> <p>Some factors that help determine whether a property is your primary residence include:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • voting, • vehicle registrations, and • length of time spent each year on the property. <p>The Tax Department may also request proof of residency.</p>	<p>The property must be the primary residence of at least one age-eligible owner.</p>

SCHOOL TAX COLLECTION INFORMATION

Candor Central School District utilizes Tompkins-Seneca-Tioga BOCES for tax collection services. TST BOCES performed tax collection through October 31st, at which time, by law, the remaining unpaid collection was turned over to the respective County Treasurer, and any further tax questions should now be directed there.
