

The vendor shall not acquire any legal or equitable rights relative to the contract services until a contract containing terms and conditions acceptable to the Department is executed. The Department further reserves the right to cancel this Notice of Conditional Contract Award at any time prior to the execution of a written contract.

As stated in the RFP, following announcement of this award decision, all submissions in response to the RFP are considered public records available for public inspection pursuant to the State of Maine Freedom of Access Act (FOAA). 1 M.R.S. §§ 401 et seq.; 5 M.R.S. § 1825-B (6).

This award decision is conditioned upon final approval by the State Procurement Review Committee and the successful negotiation of a contract. A Statement of Appeal Rights has been provided with this letter; see below.

Dear Superintendent Theoharides:

The State Board of Education has granted Concept Approval to Sanford School Department for an addition and renovation to the Margaret Chase Smith School, a PreK-4, 517 student Elementary School; a retrofit of the Sanford Junior High School into a PreK-4, 513 student Elementary School; and a retrofit of the Sanford High School into a 5-8, 1,002 student Middle School. Preliminary plans and cost estimates based on long range planning for the project have been submitted and the concept reflected therein is approved by the State Board of Education. The project is consistent with policies and priorities as adopted by the State Board of Education. Concept Approval grants authorization to proceed with further development of the Elementary School projects consistent with State Board of Education general policies in anticipation of submission for Design and Funding Approval.

Enclosed you will find a copy of the Project Concept Budget.

- Total project cost is estimated to be: \$42,999,125.
- The total bonded amount will not exceed \$42,999,125.
- The maximum amount approved for inclusion for debt service is \$42,999,125.
- The local only share of the budget is projected to be: \$0.

The Commissioner of Education will establish the bond sale date which is currently projected to be Fall 2018.

Student Success & Engagement Committee Report

The Student Success & Engagement Committee (formerly the Dropout Prevention Committee) met on Monday, May 22nd. Maine Revised Statute Title 20-A, 5103 states that the Superintendent shall annually establish a dropout prevention committee. The purpose of the committee is to:

- **Study dropout and truancy data**
- **Identify problems and reasons students dropout or don't attend school**
- **Make recommendations for addressing problems**
- **Submit report and/or plan of action to school committee**

Committee Membership shall be composed of the following members

- **School Administrator**
- **Teacher and School Counselor**
- **Parent**
- **Attendance Officer**
- **SHS Student**
- **SHS Dropout**
- **School Committee Member**

We reviewed the graduation / drop out data that is attached. The following information is included in your packet with this report:

- **Sanford School Dept. dropouts/expulsions**
- **Dropout and completers past 6 years**
- **Comparison w/ other southern Maine HS**

To date, we have thirty (30) students who have dropped out of Sanford High School for a variety of reasons. The final number will not be known until the fall of 2017. Our current percentage is just over 3%. Last year's we had 32 dropouts with a final percentage of 3.14%.

Our daily attendance for the 2015-2016 school year was just over 95% which was an increase and over the average of the comparable southern Maine schools.

The committee discussed the following:

- **Reasons students drop out of school**
- **The importance of maintaining of contacts w/ potential dropouts to extend alternative opportunities**
- **We need to share this dropout data with teachers and administrators.**
- **Continue to use of human services programs to prevent and help dropouts**

- Review school department policies and procedures on suspension, expulsion and other disciplinary action to gauge their effectiveness and impact on dropouts
- Identify any discriminatory practices and attitudes within school department that could cause students to dropout.

- SRO's at SJHS and SHS
- Cadets and Cub Cadets program
- Attendance Officers at SHS and K-8
- Community Partners
- 9th Grade Orientation program

- Jobs for Maine Graduates Program at SHS and SJHS
- Alternative Learning program at SHS
- Bridge Program
- Room 11 and on-line opportunities at SHS
- Sophomore Awareness program
- SRTC
- Extended Learning Opportunities at SHS
- Backpack program
- Involved teachers
- Academic prescriptions for students who fail with a grade between 60-69
- Learning works
- Attendance protocols.

The following interventions or recommendations were suggested and discussed:

- Expanded career exploratory opportunities for grades 9 and 10
- SRTC visits for SJHS students
- Explore pre-voc option for SRTC
- Expand summer school opportunities
- Consider in-school suspension models
- Add late bus
- Address teacher inconsistency
- Expand JMG
- Smaller class sizes
- SRTC not available for most students until junior year.
